Lectio Divina

READ: Jesus identified himself as the good shepherd. He described the good shepherd as a person who gives his life for the sheep. Jesus compared the good shepherd with the hired hand. The hired hand works for pay, does not care for the sheep, and would not protect the sheep from the wolf. The good shepherd knows his sheep and lavs his life for them. Jesus also mentioned the other sheep outside such particular sheepfold. Jesus said that eventually there will be one flock under one shepherd. Jesus, being loved by the Father, emphasized the fact that no one could take his life from him but would lay it down freely.

REFLECT: Whenever we would reflect on the passion and death of Jesus, we normally think of a Jesus who was cornered by his enemies and helplessly killed in shame. However, John's Gospel depicts that Jesus was never stripped of his glory and dignity even during his passion and death. In today's Gospel, Jesus said it clearly that no one could take his life away, that he laid it down freely. Therefore, it was a decision made by Jesus. He chose us, laying down his life. Can we also do something good-not because we have already run out of choices but because we know that it is the right thing to do?

PRAY: Let us pray for guidance that we may be decisive to do what is right.

ACT: Let us now decisively change from a consumeristic to a simpler lifestyle.

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

In this reading, pay attention to the affinity between the sign (the crippled man restored to health-"saved") and what is signified (all human beings "saved" in the name of Jesus). In other words, the saved man is a sign of all of us saved in the name of Jesus. Israel has rejected him. But there is no salvation in anyone else!

The Responsorial Psalm states the same: "It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to trust in man." Where do you turn in times of depression or when you are "crippled" because things do not go your way?

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

In faith, following Jesus of Nazareth, we see the ultimate reality as a person, and are privileged to call him "Father." The author of John uses similar language. If God can be called "Father," then we are his children and feel safe, because we are taken care of.

A living relationship of child-Father may save us from ourselves when all around us seems absurdity. The key to such a living relationship with God our Father is to keep in touch with him by prayerful Bible reading.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

This reading brings out the idea of salvation with another sign or image, namely, that of the shepherd tending his flock. As suggested in the First Reading, do not turn somewhere else, to a hired hand, who lets you down when you need help most.

The Lord Jesus knows you and is concerned. He laid down his life for you. Turn to him in prayer and meditative encounter in your Bible and you will find peace of mind.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH Vatican City — April 17, 2024

The pope and the nine-member Council of Cardinals invited women, including an Anglican bishop, to make presentations at their meetings in December and in February as well. The council met April 15-16 in the Domus Sanctae Marthae, the pope's residence, the Vatican press office said. On the first day, Sister Regina da Costa Pedro, a member of the Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate and director of the Pontifical Mission Societies of Brazil, shared "concrete stories and the thoughts of some Brazilian women," the press office said. Stella Morra, a professor of theology at Rome's Pontifical Gregorian University, "examined the role cultures have in the recognition of the role of women in different parts of the world," the press office said. A priest and two women made presentations at the council's December meeting and published their papers in Italian in a book with a foreword by Francis, "Smaschilizzare La Chiesa?" ("De-masculinize the Church?). During the preparation for the synod on synodality and during its first assembly in October, the pope wrote in the foreword, "We realized that we have not listened enough to the voice of women in the church and that the church still has a lot to learn." "It is necessary to listen to each other to 'de-masculinize' the church because the church is a communion of men and women who share the same faith and the same baptismal dignity," he wrote. At the February meeting, the pope and cardinals heard from: Bishop Jo Bailey Wells, deputy secretary-general of the Anglican Communion; Salesian Sister Linda Pocher, a professor of Christology and Mariology at Rome's Pontifical Faculty of Educational Sciences "Auxilium"; and Giuliva Di Berardino, a consecrated virgin and liturgist from the Diocese of Verona, Italy. Bailey Wells said she was invited to "describe the Anglican journey in regard to the ordination of women, both in the Church of England and across the (Anglican) Communion." At the April meeting, the Vatican said, the second day began with a report about the ongoing Synod of Bishops on synodality by Cardinal Mario Grech, secretary-general of the Synod of Bishops, and Msgr. Piero Coda, secretary general of the International Theological Commission.
