## WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

In this speech of Peter, Luke wants to bring out the basic message of the early Church: the Lord's rejection ("they put him to death") God's vindication ("God raised him") and the apostles' witness to the Christevent ("he commissioned us to preach"). Referring to the stone rejected and made the headstone of the corner, the Church applies Psalm 118 to the death and resurrection of Christ. Indeed, "this is the day the Lord has made let us rejoice and be glad."

## WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

The First Reading proclaims the living Christ, his life, death and resurrection. The Second Reading tells us about the implications of all of this for us. Through baptism you have died to your own sinful and egotistic self and you have been raised up to a new life with Christ. You are a Christian. This life is hidden. In its fullness, it will appear in the life to come. The lesson is "Think of what is above not on what is on earth." This is a strong Semitic saying with the obvious meaning. Do not be so captivated by the tinsel of life or so infected with the commercialism of the day that you lose sight of the things above!

## WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

The point (God's Word) seems to be: "He saw and believed." The disciples were slow in coming to a realization of the resurrection since the Holy Spirit had not yet come to enlighten the Church concerning all these divine mysteries. We need the Holy Spirit! "God our Father, ... let our celebration today raise us up and renew our lives by the Spirit that is within us."

#### **KNOW YOUR CHURCH**

March 24th, 2023

San Diego Cardinal Robert McElroy sharply criticized the Eternal Word Television Network, the conservative Catholic U.S. media conglomerate, in an interview with Spanish magazine Vida Nueva published on March 24.

Vida Nueva <u>asked</u> McElroy about the decision of newly installed Bishop Fernando Prado of San Sebastián, Spain, to ban diocesan television from carrying content produced by EWTN. Prado <u>wrote</u> that he made the decision "trying to support the communion of the diocese with the Successor of Peter."

"I would not have EWTN on diocesan EWTN worries me because it represents a giant of economic and cultural power connected to a religious viewpoint that is fundamentally critical of the pope," the cardinal said.

"The main anchors of the channel constantly minimize the abilities and theological knowledge of Francis, cite Archbishop Carlo Maria Viganò's slander of the pope and try to move the world away from the reforms the pope is signaling," said McElroy.

Viganò, a former Vatican ambassador to the U.S., has called on Francis to resign the papacy.edia either," McElroy responded. McElroy said that Francis has encountered so much opposition because of his "intention of completing the work of the Second Vatican Council," as well as his "constant inclusion of the experiences and spiritual points of view of the Global South at the center of the life of the church."

In the U.S., McElroy said that this opposition is exacerbated by Catholics' worries that "the pope is open to exploring paths of pastoral action in the church that are not prohibited by existing doctrinal formulations."

"Francis' attention is centered on the life of the believer in its complexity and on how the Gospel and the tradition of the church can apply in an effective and compassionate way to the lives of those who struggle ardently to draw close to God and follow his path in the midst of so many challenges," said McElroy.
