The Prayer of the Synod: Adsumus Sancte Spiritus

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord - Sunday 7th January, 2024

The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek epiphainen, which means "to manifest," "appear," or "make known." The Feast of the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus, the Son of God, to the world. "Jesus is the Savior of the world.



Lectio Divina

Read: The first reading tells of Abraham. God promised him that he would be the father of many nations. The Letter to the Hebrews lauds Abraham and Sarah for their faith and their trust that God would fulfill his promise. The Gospel recounts the Presentation of Jesus in the temple where Simeon and Anna recognize him as the Messiah, a light to the nations.

Reflect: Tolstoy wrote that all happy families are alike, but every unhappy family is unhappy in its own way. Today we are reminded that each family is called to holiness in its own way. Though each family has its own call, circumstances and challenges, the example of the Holy Family and the counsel of Scripture can lead us to holiness.

All holiness is grounded in faith in God. On our own, we can do nothing. We rely on the grace of God. We can grow in holiness by living upright lives, committing ourselves to following God's commandments and offering ourselves in loving service. Our holiness is strengthened by prayer and fasting that allow us to listen to the voice of the Spirit and open our hearts more fully to God.

Pray: Jesus, make our families holy like your family.

Act: Share a family meal and conversation.

WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

Abraham put his faith in the Lord, who credited it to him as an act of righteousness." Abraham renounced all certainty that can come from human beings. And as a result, in old age he and his wife had a son, Isaac. Through that act, God reveals his love and faithfulness. Hence, the family becomes the sign of the faith of human beings and of the love of God.

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

The author of Hebrews here extols Abraham's faith, which occupies a prominent place in the History of Salvation. For Abraham believed God's promises and put his faith in him, living that faith in every phase of his life. And since God is faithful to his promises, faith becomes the source of hope and happiness for his family. We should place our trust in God's promises.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Luke describes the Jewish purification rite, observed by the Holy Family, as a manifestation of our Lord. He is introduced as "the Christ of the Lord," the anointed king or Messiah, who meets two representatives of his people, Simeon and Anna. "He took him into his arms"; this was the customary ritual of blessing children. "You yourself [Mary] a sword shall pierce": indicates the pain experienced by Mary as the Mother of the Redeemer.

Are you willing to accept our Lord as controversial? His values, "do's and don'ts," are not always the same ones that your friends and associates go by! Take a stand!

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

Pope Francis inaugurated a new catechetical series on vices and virtues during Wednesday's general audience by opening with the story of Adam and Eve, which introduces "the dynamic of evil and temptation" and points toward the dangers of dialoguing with the devil.

The Holy Father instructed the pilgrims gathered in the Paul VI Audience Hall at the Vatican that the best way to eschew the precipitous fall into temptation is to "never argue with the devil; he is astute and intelligent," with the pope adding that "the devil is a deceiver. Never talk to him, because he is smarter than all of us and will make us pay." The pope pointed to the Book of Genesis, where evil, or the devil, is manifest in the infamous figure of the serpent. That animal's insidiousness is often unnoticed as it is able to "camouflage itself well in its environment," Francis said.

In the biblical account of Adam and Eve, the Garden of Eden, and the fall of man, the progenitors thought the serpent to be benign. But, the pope warned, the devil is a master tactician and shape shifter who was able to instill doubt, which was veiled as "wicked gossip."

At the same time Pope Francis noted that we ought to think of the tree of knowledge not as a "prohibition" imposed by God on "the use of reason" but rather as his way of introducing a "measure of wisdom." In this way God is signaling to us to be cognizant of our limits so we do not falsely believe that we "are the master[s] of everything, because pride is the beginning of all evil."
