#### Lectio Divina

Today's readings Read: introduce us to Jesus' mission. The prophet Isaiah tells us that the Messiah will come to banish darkness and death, replacing them with joy. Paul writes about the unity of those who follow Jesus, a unity founded in the Gospel and in In Matthew's the cross. Gospel, Jesus calls us to abandon the past, change the way we live, and follow him.

**Reflect:** By baptism, we are united in the Body of Christ

and so we share in his mission. Like Peter and Andrew, James and John, we are called to leave behind anything that is not God and follow Jesus wholeheartedly. Change is never easy, facing our sinful behaviors can painful. embarrassing and Avoiding occasions of sin is difficult and may cost us activities and relationships that we found pleasurable. It is fair to ask what we get in exchange for this effort. Jesus tells us what we will gain the very kingdom of God. That kingdom - a kingdom of joy, unity, love and hope - is near.

**Pray:** Lord Jesus, help me to love you above all things, to follow you and to come to your kingdom.

**Act:** Seek the Lord's forgiveness for your sins and make a firm commitment to change your ways.

On Wednesday 25th January we celebrate the **Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle.** 

### For love of Christ, Paul bore every burden.

Paul, more than anyone else, has shown us what man really is, and in what our nobility consists, and of what virtue this particular animal is capable. Each day he aimed ever higher; each day he rose up with greater ardor and faced with new eagerness the dangers that threatened him. He summed up his attitude in the words: I forget what is behind me and push on to what lies ahead. When he saw death imminent, he bade others share his joy: Rejoice and be glad with me! And when danger, injustice and abuse threatened, he said: I am content with weakness, mistreatment and persecution. These he called the weapons of righteousness, thus telling us that he derived immense profit from

Thus, amid the traps set for him by his enemies, with exultant heart he turned their every attack into a victory for himself; constantly beaten, abused and cursed, he boasted of it as though he were celebrating a triumphal procession and taking trophies home, and offered thanks to God for it all: Thanks be to God who is always victorious in us! This is why he was far more eager for the shameful abuse that his zeal in preaching brought upon him than we are for the most pleasing honors, more eager for death than we are for life, for poverty than we are for wealth; he yearned for toil far more than others yearn for rest after toil. The one thing he feared, indeed dreaded, was to offend God; nothing else could sway him. Therefore, the only thing he really wanted was always to please God.

The most important thing of all to him, however, was that he knew himself to be loved by Christ. Enjoying this love, he considered himself happier than anyone else; were he without it, it would be no satisfaction to be the friend of principalities and powers. He preferred to be thus loved and be the least of all, or even to be among the damned, than to be without that love and be among the great and honored.

### WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME:

The setting is a civil war between the two kingdoms into which the Jewish nation was split after the death of Solomon. Judah (south) and Israel (north) . Judah had called in Assyrians to come to her help. They invaded Israel and took many captives among the tribes of Zebulun and Naphtali. Isaiah saw all this as a punishment for sin, especially the king's lack of faith in God. As descendants of the great King David, they should be the representatives of God on earth. They failed! In his songs and poems, Isaiah dreams about an ideal king to come, a true king of peace, who will be Immanuel—God –with-us. Matthew sees Isaiah's aspiration fulfilled in Jesus Christ. "wait for the Lord with courage!"

### WHAT THE 2ND READING SAYS TO ME:

There is dissension in the congregation of Corinth. Paul points out that all members are called to be Christ's ministers and disciples. All share in the mission of Jesus, namely, to be a light to other human beings in darkness! But a divided house causes misfortune and misery. Accepting one another, human as we are, priests, members of the parish council and ordinary parishioners, we should be one in the faith and in dedication Christian to discipleship and service.

### WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME:

Matthew. a Jew writing for Christians of Jewish background, sees Isaiah's dreams fulfilled in Jesus Christ, who begins missionary activity in the land of Zebulun and Naphtali. Jesus is a prophet like the ancient prophets od Israel. He is a teacher. He is the Servant of Yahweh. He is the Son of God, not just adopted as Hebrew kings were at their enthronement, but in a very unique way. Jesus is the great light, envisaged by Isaiah in the first Bible reading. Like the first disciples, all Christians share in Christ's mission of service.

#### **KNOW YOUR CHURCH**

A drunken thief was injured after falling on the sword of a statue of St. Michael the Archangel that he was trying to steal from a church in Monterrey, Mexico. Local media reported that during the early hours of Jan. 14, Carlos Alonso, 32, allegedly went to the Christ the King Parish in downtown Monterrey to rob the church.

In the darkness, Alonso reportedly jumped over the fence in front of the church entrance, broke a glass door, and entered the church. While trying to flee with a statue of St. Michael the Archangel, the alleged thief tripped and fell on the angel's sword, seriously injuring his neck. Some passersby saw the wounded man at the church doors and called for medical help.

Monterrey Civil Protection personnel arrived at the scene, cut the padlock on the main gate of the fence, and saved the would-be thief's life.

After stabilizing the injured man, the rescuers took him to a clinic to be treated and to get more information about the damage that may have been caused.

It is expected that once he has recovered, the suspect will be turned over to the public prosecutor's office, and the punishment he could face for the damage to the church will be determined.

The statue of St. Michael the Archangel was unharmed.
