WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME.

We read about the success of the disciples witnessing to the Lord Their words and signs Jesus. bring people of all walks of life, even "the despised Samaritans," to faith in the risen Lord Jesus. By imposing hands on them, the apostles receive them into the Christian fellowship whose headquarters are still in Jerusalem at this time. Be on your guard to insure that diversity remains under the umbrella of unity in the Spirit. "Vae Soli!" — Do not be a loner! Opinions shared only by a very few or by no one else are suspicious, to say the least.

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Peter addresses Christians who are defamed because of their way of life in Christ. He urges them to have hope and to be ready to reply when anyone asks them questions. The point (God's word to you and me) seems to be. This can happen to you as well. Do your coworkers know that you are a Christian in the Catholic tradition? You have a hopeful, optimistic outlook on life. Can you reply when people ask questions? It requires reading: Are you up-to-date concerning the "daring and creative steps" the Church is taking nowadays, adapting itself to new situations?

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME Jesus reminds his followers that he will not remain with them visibly. But in the Spirit he will! He will send a Paraclete (advocate), a counselor, a defender, to help them. Jesus calls him "the Spirit of truth," and this Spirit is promised to all of us, "to be with you always." This is the reason for our hope and optimistic outlook on life. Being different, let us remain one in the Spirit! In faith "you know him, because he remains with you and will be in you.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

Vatican's new bishops' prefect shares his 'portrait of a bishop'

A bishop should nurture closeness to Christ, share the beauty of the faith, use social media wisely, and have a universal vision, the new head of the Vatican's Dicastery for Bishops shared this week.

Archbishop Robert Francis Prevost, who took up his new role in April, <u>spoke to Vatican News</u> about what he considers to be the "portrait of a bishop."

"We are often preoccupied with teaching doctrine, the way of living our faith, but we risk forgetting that our first task is to teach what it means to know Jesus Christ and to bear witness to our closeness to the Lord," he told Vatican News.

"This comes first: to communicate the beauty of the faith, the beauty and joy of knowing Jesus," he added. "It means that we ourselves are living it and sharing this experience. "Prevost was appointed prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops by Pope Francis in January. A member of the Order of St. Augustine, Prevost had been bishop of Chiclayo, Peru, since 2015.

Born in Chicago in 1955, he led the Augustinian order as prior general from Rome for more than a decade after serving as a missionary priest for the order in Peru in the 1990s.

In addition to leading the office responsible for helping the pope choose the world's Catholic episcopate, Prevost is also president of the Pontifical Commission for Latin America.

In a May 4 interview, he told Vatican News that "a fundamental element of the portrait of a bishop is being a pastor, capable of being close to the members of the community, starting with the priests for whom the bishop is father and brother." To live this closeness to all, without excluding anyone," he added.

He also said a bishop must be "Catholic" in the sense that he looks beyond his diocese to have a "broader vision of the Church and reality, and experience the universality of the Church.
