WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

The prophet Elijah is depressed. Queen Jezebel has forced him to get out of the kingdom. In fear, he is fleeing for his life. On his journey through the desert to the mountain of God, Horeb, he is strengthened by a hearth cake and a jug of water provided by the LORD. "Then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights.

God's word in and through this tradition could be: On our lifetime journey to the mountain where we hope to meet God, we need the food that today's Gospel identifies as Christ, the bread of life.

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

"Live in love, as Christ loved us." Serious Christians are concerned with the great value of love as the value without which there can be no lasting happiness. It is the quintessence of Christ's message. What kind of person would I be if I would not have met Christ?

Let us not be like children, who take wealth for granted. God chose you and me, but he did so freely, not out of necessity. Let us show our appreciation by being guided by the precious insight that there is no greater value than love.

WHAT THE GOSPEL **SAYS TO ME**

Using the symbolism of bread, Jesus indicates that we need him on our journey through life. "I [Jesus] am the bread of life..... Whoever eats this bread will live forever." In other words, a person closely related to Jesus Christ will not die the death of alienation from God. The essential condition for this is faith (trust) in the Lord Jesus: "Whoever believes has eternal life."

Christians see the Eucharistic bread and wine, signs of Christ's mysterious presence to us, as a viaticum, "food for our journey" to the mountain where we hope to meet God (First Reading). Gratefully, we should "take and eat it" as the Lord has told us to do.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

Beware of False Prophets

In the Catholic weekday liturgy, we are currently hearing from Prophet Jeremiah, who warns us not to listen to false prophets.

Before the Second Vatican Council (1962) -1965). Catholics only heard a very limited number of Scripture passages during Mass. On innumerable weekdays in the 1950s, I heard the parable of the 10 wise and 10 foolish virgins because this was the Gospel used on feasts of virgin saints, which pack the Catholic calendar.

One of the great liturgical reforms after the Second Vatican Council was an expansion of the Scripture readings used in weekday and Sunday lectionaries so that Catholics now hear a lot more of the Bible than we did in the past. Sadly, Catholics are still less familiar with the Bible than our Protestant brothers and sisters, but at least the church is now encouraging the laity to read the Scriptures.

The daily Scripture readings are readily available on the U.S. bishops' conference website, in apps such as iBreviary and, if you are lazy like me, ask Alexa to "Play Catholic Daily." Other apps, like Pray As You Go, provide music and reflections with the readings.

In even-numbered years, like 2024, we hear from Jeremiah at this time of the year. On Monday, part of the 18th week in Ordinary Time, Jeremiah (Jeremiah 28:1-17) is going after Hananiah, a false prophet, who is prophesying the defeat of the Babylonian Empire and the return of the temple vessels that Nebuchadnezzar took to Babylon as plunder. Hananiah is promising to bring back all the Jewish exiles from Babylon and make Israel great again.

"I will break the yoke of the king of Babylon," The Lord says, according to Hananiah.

Jeremiah wishes this were true, but he warns the people that following Hananiah will simply make matters worse. They will trade a yoke of wood for a yoke of iron
