#### Lectio Divina

READ: From the synagogue Jesus went to the home of Simon and Andrew where he healed Simon's mother-in-law. In the evening, all the sick and those who were possessed by evil spirits were brought to Jesus. Jesus healed the sick and drove out demons. Very early in the morning, Jesus went off to a deserted place where he prayed. Simon and the others looked for him. Jesus invited them to go to the nearby villages where he could also preach.

REFLECT: Today's Gospel seems to present a summary of Jesus daily ministry. Jesus would cure the sick, cast out evil spirits and proclaim the Kingdom of God. Humanly speaking, it must have been a very tiring day. But where could Jesus get his energy, enabling him to do his active ministry for the benefit of the people? The Gospel suggests that the energy that was consumed in Jesus daily ministry sprang up from his faithfulness to his prayer life. Jesus has shown his disciples his profound relationship with his Father. He shares with us his followers the secret of a meaningful ministry - our immersion in prayer. We are challenged to be faithful to our prayer life no matter how busy our daily schedules are.

**PRAY**: Let us pray that we may selflessly give ourselves in the service of others and that all our ministerial services spring up from our prayer life.

**ACT**: Let us set a time for our daily personal prayer and be faithful to it.

## "People brought to Jesus all the sick and those who had evil spirits"



#### WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO

ME. - In the framework of a folktale, a Hebrew sage tries to approach the mystery of suffering. If possible, take time today to read the prologue: Job 1:1-22, 2:1-13, and the epilogue: Job 42:7-17, which constitute the original folktale. Between those sections, the author composed the poetical dialogues on the problem of suffering, but no clear solution is offered. Today's passage is very pessimistic about the human condition. Notice that the author of Job did not have a clear idea of a life hereafter, which formed part of the fuller revelation brought us by Christ. We should connect this passage with the healing ministry of Jesus in the Gospel and the Responsorial Psalm: "Praise the Lord.... [who] heals 1 the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME - Paul considered it his call in life, his duty, to preach the Gospel. And he asked for no reward, though he could rightly expect it. Jesus had told his disciples: "The laborer deserves his payment". Paul did not want to make full use of the authority that the Gospel gave him. He earned his living by tent making. This was only one of the qualities that made him a great man.

#### WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

In reading about the healing ministry of the Lord Jesus, we should keep in mind that the ancient Hebrews did not see a scientific relation between medication and healing, as we do. understanding of medication was mainly a magical one. Sickness was caused by evil spirits. Hence, a sick person turned first of all to the priest or a holy man for help. Healing was identical with expelling demons. Thus, the ministry of healing is one of the signs of the messianic era, the time of salvation from the power of Satan and of God's kingdom on earth. Proclaiming the good news and healing went hand in hand. According to Mark, these healings foreshadowed the ultimate healing of all the brokenhearted by Jesus' death on the cross. When we are depressed and suffering, and perhaps tempted to think as Job did, we should meditate on our Lord's death and resurrection, and see pain as our passage to eternal life with him.

#### KNOW YOUR CHURCH

#### Vatican City - January 29th, 2024

Making a list of which sinners are welcome in the church and which sinners are not goes against the teaching of the Gospel, Pope Francis told an Italian newspaper. The pope said more than one person had asked him why he approved the declaration of the Dicastery of the Doctrine of the Faith permitting priests to give informal blessings to gay couples and couples not married in the church as long as those blessings do not give the appearance of blessing the couple's union. "I respond that the Gospel is to sanctify everyone," the pope said in the interview with La Stampa published Jan. 29. Francis said that when he was in Lisbon, Portugal, in August for World Youth Day and repeatedly said the church is open to "todos, todos, todos" everyone, everyone, everyone — he was affirming the Gospel, and particularly the parable about the wedding feast where the invited guests don't arrive so the king tells his servants to go out to the streets and invite everyone, "good and bad alike." The son of God wants us to understand that he doesn't want a select group, an elite," the pope said. "Then maybe someone gets 'smuggled in'? But at that point, God takes care of it and indicates the path" forward. "When they ask me, 'But can these people who are in such an inappropriate moral situation also enter?" the pope said, "I assure them, 'Everyone. The Lord said it.'" "I get questions like this, especially recently after some of my decisions," Francis said. Asked specifically about the blessings of couples, the pope said it was important that the people requesting them are doing so with "good will" and that they are given "precise instructions about the Christian life," including an explanation that the church is blessing them and not their union. "But we are all sinners. Why then draw up a list of sinners who can enter the church and a list of sinners who cannot be in the church? This is not the Gospel," he said. The people who are "vehemently protesting" the decision to allow the blessings "belong to small ideological groups," although that is not the case with bishops from many parts of sub-Saharan Africa, the pope said. "For them, homosexuality is something 'ugly' from a cultural point of view; they do not tolerate it."
