#### Lectio Divina

**READ**: Jesus went around the village. He taught the people. He called the Twelve and sent them two by two. He gave them authority over unclean spirits. He commanded them to take only staff and nothing else in their journey. The disciples were to wear sandals but they must not have an extra tunic. Jesus gave them an instruction to stay in the house that would welcome them while they must shake off the dust of their feet in any place that would not accept them. The disciple set out to proclaim that it was time to repent. They drove out demons and healed many sick people.

REFLECT: Jesus summoned the Twelve and then sent them two by two. Prior to the calling of the Twelve, Jesus himself was the one who roamed around the village while teaching the people. Moreover, before the disciples were sent into mission, Jesus gave them a set of instructions. The disciples were to proclaim God's kingdom, drive out demons and cure the sick. The disciples were empowered, instructed and sent as instruments through which God was to bring salvation to many people in the places where the disciples were sent as missionaries. The disciples were empowered, instructed and sent to care for the people because God, unto whom the mission truly belongs, cares for the people.

PRAY: We pray that God will strengthen our missionary spirit.

**ACT**: Today, let us do our missionary duty by attending to the needs of someone whom we know is presently sick.

SAINT OF THE DAY - JULY 15th

Bonaventure is known as a "Doctor of the Church." In addition to theological and philosophical works, St. Bonaventure has left us numerous spiritual treatieses, some of which have been translated into English including the Journey of the Soul to God, Tree of Life, and The Life of Saint Francis. St. Bonaventure had a deeply rooted prayer life which he outlines in his writings entitled Holiness of Life. In this text, he explains that it is in prayer that God assists us in exposing all of the vices and sins that hinder us from holiness.

#### WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

In this passage we see two opposing conceptions of religion. Amaziah, the priest of the sanctuary in Bethel, (the Northern Kingdom of Israel), favors a religion that stands for the status quo, is loyal to patriotism, and is loath to "rock the boat," which might upset the constituency. Amos, an "outside agitator" (from Judah, the Southern Kingdom), preaches the word of God and does not follow the line of smooth talkers. He blames the congregation for its social injustice, and consequently is expelled from the sanctuary.

Read also Amos 2:6-8; 4:1-5. His fate points to the Gospel, where the Twelve are told that something similar could happen to them.

### WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul outlines a beautiful picture of who we are as Christians. We should be grateful for our election as God's adopted children and have understanding when preachers of the Gospel constantly refer to it. They are not allowed to water down the message in order to avoid hurting feelings!

### WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

The mission of the Twelve consists in preaching the need for repentance, which necessarily implies confrontation with evil. In addition to preaching, mention is made of exorcism, and healing, including anointing. The possibility of not being accepted should be considered.

What is the mission of the Church? It is similar to that of the Twelve and Amos of the First Reading, and we should consider whether or not a "civil religion" fits this mold.

#### KNOW YOUR CHURCH

LOVE YOUR PRIESTS According to recent studies... a great number of priests quit each year. They don't quit because they have a lack of faith in God. They don't quit because they don't believe in the calling God has placed on their life. Most don't even quit because of financial reasons. Priests quit because they are overwhelmed with mental exhaustion. Until you're a priest you'll never fully understand what it's like to carry spiritual burdens for people. Getting up in the middle of night, praying for your family of faith. Awakened in the middle of night with someone on your heart. Overwhelmed with concern by a persons absence or distance. Your mind continually occupied with the presentation of the upcoming Sunday message - how to preach it, what to teach on, how do we apply it? Getting critiqued on a continual basis. Being told you need to do better or that some areas of the church simply need to be better. Priests invest their whole life into people and yet people will turn their backs on their Priests at the first sign of a storm, usually without a conversation. Priests stand in the middle of disputes. Priests stand in the middle of gossip. Priests council broken marriages. Priests comfort those who have suffered Priests navigate the waters of imperfect people with a desire to see each one thrive in their faith. They long for spiritual breakthroughs. Your priest craves the very best for you. All of this, while trying to battle their own flesh and grow in their own relationship Priests see the posts. with God. Priests hear the whispers. Priests endure the negativity. Priests are continually caring for the sheep while fending off the wolves. Priest pour out and pour out - rarely being poured into.

What keeps a priest going? YOU!
You - the person who is genuinely hungry.
You - the person who worships with passion and freedom.

You - the teenager who is striving to be a follower of Jesus. You - the single mom who understands the beauty of the hope found in Christ. You - the one who walks through the door for the first time because you're in search of peace, hope, and community. Pray for your priest. Serve with your priest. Talk with your priest. Encourage your priest. They are human. They need You more than you think!
