Lectio Divina

READ: Jesus ate the Passover meal. After the meal, Jesus prayed in Gethsemane. Jesus was arrested through the betrayal of Judas Iscariot. He was first brought to the High Priest. Peter denied Jesus three times. Jesus was brought to Pilate. While releasing Barabbas, Jesus was sentenced to death. Jesus was crowned with thorns and then carried his cross to Golgotha where he was crucified. At three o'clock in the afternoon Jesus cried out loudly. Afterwards, Jesus gave up his spirit. The curtain that enclosed the temple sanctuary was torn from top to bottom. The captain professed that Jesus is the Son of God. There were some women watching from a distance. In the evening Joseph of Arimathea took and laid Jesus' body in a tomb.

REFLECT: Today is Palm Sunday. The palm symbolizes ramification. Today's celebration invites us to reflect on Jesus' offering of his life, which paved the way for the birth of Christianity. The community of disciples he formed would, afterwards, spread through all the world to proclaim the Good News. Through his sacrifice, the mission of Jesus of bringing the fullness of life, began to branch out. As Christians, we should be aware that there is no true sacrifice that is wasted. The good effects of our sacrifices for others can always go a long way.

PRAY: Let us pray that we may truly learn the value of sacrifice.

ACT: Let us do one sacrificial act today and offer it for the wellbeing of a person we love.

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME This reading is taken from the third song of the Servant of Yahweh. As mentioned at the feast of the Baptism of our Lord, it is not clear whom the inspired writer had in mind when he composed these four songs, describing the ideal Servant (Son) of God. Is he a collective person: Israel, God's people? Is he a king of the past or the Messiah (anointed king) to come? In any case, the Christian community applied these hymns very early to Jesus and they are used throughout Holy Week as a beautiful commentary on the passion narratives. Indeed, "the Son of Man [Jesus] did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many".

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

This text is actually a Christ hymn, sung in church. It beautifully describes our Lord's utmost humiliation, which he suffered on the cross. By being obedient, he made up for our sinful disobedience. But this hymn sings also of Christ's exaltation by the Father. Meditating on the Lord's suffering and death, as Christians do during Holy Week, we should keep both sides of the Christ event in mind. It is suffering and death that actually constitutes a passage to exaltation. Good Friday and Easter belong together even in our lives!

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Paul states: "For our sakes [God] made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him". Jesus identified himself entirely with sinful humankind, whom he freed from sin and death. Each of the evangelists relates the narrative of Christ's passion with only a few different memories of the tragedy. In Matthew and Mark, Jesus' last words are: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?". Luke remembers that on the cross Jesus promised paradise to the criminal who repented and that Jesus said: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit". All three relate the Lord's Supper, which Jesus gave us to celebrate as a memorial of his passion, death, and resurrection. Prayerful meditation on Jesus' passion should make us grateful for what Jesus did. He has said: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends".

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

"My secret, my great secret, is to pray," said Sister Inah Canabarro Lucas, the oldest nun in the world at 115 years of age. "I pray the rosary every day for all the people around the world." The Teresian nun is also the oldest person in Brazil and Latin America, according to the Gerontological Research Group.

Sister Inah expressed her good humor and joy in the few words she managed to say in a March 9 interview with ACI Digital, CNA's Portuguese-language news partner. She repeated a prayer several times to the Virgin Mary, praying to her "for all the people of the entire world."

The nun currently lives in Porto Alegre in Rio Grande do Sul state in Santo Enrique de Ossó Home, adjacent to the Provincial House of the Teresian Sisters of Brazil, the community she entered in 1927 at the age of 19. According to the home's coordinator, Sister Lúcia Ignez Bassotto, Sister Inah "is always focused on others and not on herself." She is "a very resilient person, isn't demanding, appreciates everything, thinks that everything is fine, has enormous admiration for the congregation, for the company. She prays for everyone, she is concerned for everyone." "Her life is truly exemplary," continued Sister Lúcia, who has known Sister Inah since she was a student in the town of Sant'Ana do Livramento. She continues to participate in community prayers, and she likes to be in the garden and spend time with her sisters. Sister Lúcia said that although the elderly nun's health has declined a little in the last couple of weeks, on the days when she is well she is very talkative and playful. Until recently, she continued, Sister Inah "painted napkins, made cards, did many things. When she had nothing to do, she would pick up a deck of cards and start playing.
