Lectio Divina

READ: On the first day of the Sabbath, in the evening, the disciples locked themselves up out of fear of the Jews. Despite the locked doors, Jesus stood in their midst while giving them the greeting of peace. Jesus showed them his hands and side. Upon seeing Jesus, the disciples were filled with joy. Immediately after, Jesus sent them in the same way that the Father had sent him. Then he asked them to receive the Holy Spirit while breathing on them. Jesus also gave them the authority to forgive sins.

REFLECT: While the synoptic tradition tells of the ascension of Jesus, and that of Luke narrates the descent of the Holy Spirit after Jesus' ascension, the Gospel of John narrates the immediate reception of the Holy Spirit by the disciples during one of his post resurrection appearances. Jesus' sending of the Holy Spirit upon them happened immediately when Jesus breathed on them. We may reflect on the way the narrative ends. Simultaneous with the reception of the Holy Spirit by the disciples is the authority shared to them by Jesus as regards the forgiveness of sins. We need to understand that whenever Jesus spoke about the forgiveness of sins, it was always profoundly connected with compassion. Thus, a disciple who has already received the Holy Spirit is not only peaceful and joyful but also compassionate.

PRAY: Come Holy Spirit and make us more compassionate.

ACT: Let us exercise compassion by being kinder to the people in our workplace this week.

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

The Bible, especially the New Testament, should never be read in the past tense. It is God's word to you and me now! Jesus is alive. His Spirit is with every Christian. This is the meaning of the Christ event, meaning-fully celebrated at Easter, Ascension, and Pentecost, three aspects of the one mystery. Luke follows the early Christian custom of celebrating the communication of the Spirit at the conclusion of the "great fifty days," our Pentecost. Hence, he relates the outpouring of the Spirit as we have it in the First Reading. John puts the communication of the Spirit on Easter day (Gospel). The gift of the Spirit is one with the risen Lord Jesus. Notice that both traditions stress that the Christian message is not just for the Jews but for all people. Psalm 104 may refer to the renewal of nature at springtime, time and again, done by God's life-giving breath (spirit). In Christian use, it is reinterpreted and applied to the renewal of life through the Holy Spirit.

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

1 Corinthians 12:3-7,12-13

Paul is concerned about his congregation in Corinth. In it, a charismatic group has originated and glossolalia (speaking in tongues) is practiced. Its effect on the congregation has not been good. Those who have failed to participate are looked upon as second-class Christians and divisiveness has ensued. Paul does not condemn the movement. He sees in it the Spirit at work. But on the other hand he stresses that the outpouring of the Spirit must build up the community (the body of Christ), not tear it apart.

To have the Spirit means, first of all, to confess: "Jesus is Lord." This is done in various ways, not just by speaking in tongues. Each gift, even the least spectacular one, must be used for the common good! This could be a reminder to contemporary movements and counter-movements in the Church.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

John 20: 19-23

Sometimes this reading is called "the Pentecost according to John." The theological background has been explained above. Notice that Jesus uses the symbolism of "breathing," when he communicates his Spirit to the disciples. Breath was the sign of life for the ancient Hebrews, and we ourselves still practice mouth to mouth resuscitation in a case of emergency.

This symbolism of "breathing" reminds us also of the first verse of the Bible, where the "ruah Yahweh" (breath-spirit of the Creator-God) is mentioned as the life-giving and animating principle of all creation. Jesus was a Jew and as such deeply steeped in Hebrew literature and culture.

KNOW YOUR CHURCH

Pope Francis on Tuesday urged families around the world to remain close to grandparents and elderly family members, imploring loved ones to spend time with older relatives who may be facing "solitude and abandonment.

The Vatican <u>released the message</u> ahead of the fourth World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly, which takes place on July 28 this year. The pope <u>first announced the annual</u> observance in 2021.

Francis noted that the Bible contains numerous examples of the "fear of abandonment, particularly in old age and in times of pain." The theme for this year's observance is "Do Not Cast Me Off in My Old Age," a reference to Psalm 71. "All too often, loneliness is the bleak companion of our lives as elderly persons and grandparents," the pope said. He noted that when serving as archbishop of Buenos Aires he "would visit rest homes and realize how rarely those people received visits. Some had not seen their family members for many months." War often leads to high rates of elderly abandonment, the pope said. "How many of the elderly are left alone because men — youths and adults — have been called to battle, and women, above all women with small children, have left the country in order to ensure safety for their children."

Another prejudice against the old, the Holy Father argued, is the claim that they "rob the young of their future." "There is now a widespread conviction that the elderly are burdening the young with the high cost of the social services that they require, and in this way are diverting resources from the development of the community and thus from the young," the pope wrote. This is a distorted perception of reality. It assumes that the survival of the elderly puts that of the young at risk, that to favor the young, it is necessary to neglect or even suppress the elderly." Citing the biblical example of Ruth remaining by Naomi's side in the latter's old age, the Holy Father urged families: "Let us show our tender love for the grandparents and the elderly members of our families."
