Theme: God's Kingdom in the Process of Being Established Are you satisfied with the achievement of your Church? First, we should make a distinction between Jesus' movement to establish God's kingdom of justice, love, and peace on earth, and the Church as institutionalized over the centuries. Let us confine our question to the Christian movement as such and ask again: Has it achieved its goal of establishing God's kingdom on earth during the 2,000 years of its existence? The answer is obviously: We may speak only of a partial success! Seeing so much evil around us, we cannot state that God's kingdom of love, justice, and peace has been fully realized on planet earth. But was the Christian movement designed to be a one hundred percent success?

In today's Gospel, Christ, stating that he is king, says also: "For this... I came into the world, to testify to the truth." Earlier our Lord had said that the Church would be like yeast in dough. The dough is the world. Jesus never promised that the whole world would become yeast! The Church (God's people), like yeast in the dough, should have a constant uplifting impact in the community in which it is situated, and testify to the truth! If you have an uplifting impact, wherever you are, and testify to the truth by word and example, you are establishing God's kingdom of which Jesus Christ is the Messiah, the anointed king.



LECTIO DIVINA



READ: Jesus was brought to Pilate to be tried. Pilate asked Jesus if he was the king of the Jews. Jesus answered Pilate with a question, asking if Pilate's question was from him or what others told him about Jesus. Pilate retorted by asking if he was a Jew since it was Jesus' own people who brought Jesus to Pilate. Pilate further asked Jesus what the latter had done that he was handed over by his own people. Iesus said that his kingdom and kingship is not of this world. Thus, Pilate asked Jesus if Jesus was a king. Jesus answered that it was Pilate who said that Jesus was a king. Jesus added that he came into the world to bear witness to the truth and that anyone who would hear the voice of Jesus remained on the side of truth.

REFLECT: Today is the Solemnity of Christ the King. We may ask ourselves now about our relationship with Jesus. Have we already accepted Jesus as our king? If we do, the next question we need to pose to ourselves is - are we growing in terms of exercising our inner authority? Pilate was lacking in terms of inner authority, making it difficult for him to stand for the truth. Do we exercise inner authority shared to us by Jesus, or are we not better than Pilate? Can we stand for the truth?

PRAY: Let us pray that Jesus may truly reign over our lives.

ACT: Let us research on a particular historical fact which we think is now being distorted. Let us share the result of our research to people we know.

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

The setting is the same as in Daniel's reading of last week. Using apocalyptic language, the author wants to encourage people in trouble. "Son of man" is God's people, standing before the throne of the Ancient One (God). We shall overcome! One day, the Syrian empire will be destroyed, and Israel will receive "dominion, glory and kingship." In later literature the concept "Son of man" becomes a heavenly agent of judgment and salvation and finally it is applied to Jesus Christ. The author of Revelation (Second Reading) applies this passage to the final, end-time victory of Christ and God's people.

The Responsorial Psalm refers to God's kingship. The Church applies it to God's kingship as invested in Christ the King. As such we pray it today.

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Again we deal with apocalyptic language. The imagery is clearly borrowed from Daniel. The author wants to encourage his fellow faithful, as Daniel does, but he does so by referring to Jesus Christ. "Alpha and Omega" are the "A" and "Z" of the Greek alphabet, hence the meaning is: "I am the first and the last.

Note that final victory over all the peoples of the earth will only be achieved at the end, when Christ will present to his Father "an eternal and universal kingdom: a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace". Be part of it!

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Jesus was crucified on the charge that he claimed to be a Messiah, freedom-fighter. Pilate's inscription "Jesus the Nazorean, the King of the Jews", placed on the cross, was a sarcastic warning to all Messiah-pretenders to be careful, if they planned to revolt against the mighty Roman empire. Jesus reinterprets what kingship means to him. It is not political in character!

Note Jesus' statement that he came to testify to the truth. His kingdom will never be fully realized on earth. There will always be evil and enemies of the good. Jesus is king, though, and shares power with God (in Hebrew idiom "sits at God's right hand"). In heaven he constantly intercedes for us "and waits until his enemies are made his footstool", which will happen at the end of time. God's word, conveyed in this passage, may be as suggested in today's Theme.

Saint of the Day - 30th November

Saint Andrew's Story

Andrew was Saint Peter's brother, and was called with him. "As [Jesus] was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is now called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him" (Matthew 4:18-20).

John the Evangelist presents Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist. When Jesus walked by one day, John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus. "Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.' So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day" (John 1:38-39a).

Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels. Before the multiplication of the loaves, it was Andrew who spoke up about the boy who had the barley loaves and fishes. When the Gentiles went to see Jesus, they came to Philip, but Philip then had recourse to Andrew.

Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras on an X-shaped cross.

Reflection

As in the case of all the apostles except Peter and John, the Gospels give us little about the holiness of Andrew. He was an apostle. That is enough. He was called personally by Jesus to proclaim the Good News, to heal with Jesus' power and to share his life and death. Holiness today is no different. It is a gift that includes a call to be concerned about the Kingdom, an outgoing attitude that wants nothing more than to share the riches of Christ with all people.
