

Lectio Divina

READ: Some Pharisees asked Jesus if it is right for a husband to divorce his wife. The Pharisees claimed that Moses allowed them to write a certificate of dismissal in order to divorce. Jesus explained to them that Moses allowed such law due to their stubbornness. It was not the case in the beginning. God created human beings male and female. Hence, the man will leave his father and mother and be ioined to his wife. Husband and wife will become one body. Jesus taught them not to separate what God has joined. Afterwards, people were bringing little children to Jesus. The disciples rebuked those people. Jesus told the disciples to let the children come to him. He taught them that the kingdom of God belongs to such children.

REFLECT: Mark's Gospel puts the issues of the value of marriage and of the care for children side by side with each other. In the Gospel passage, Jesus explained God's divine intention for man and woman who decide to enter into marriage - that they shall become one body. The certificate of dismissal in order to divorce was allowed by Moses due to the stubbornness of the people. Moreover, Jesus showed how much he would care for the little children. In every broken marriage, the first ones to suffer are the children. Undoubtedly, Jesus placed so much importance on family life.

PRAY: Let us pray for all married couples. Let us pray for all the families.

ACT: Let us organize an informal gathering of our respective families, which can further strengthen our family bond.


October is the Month of the Rosary

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

In this beautiful allegory that teaches the oneness of husband and wife, it is the man as God's coworker who gives a name (meaning) to all of creation, in particular to sex. "Rib" suggests that both male and female belong to the one human race. "Flesh" in the Bible can stand for the whole person. Hence, "become one flesh" refers to more than the physical union. It indicates also the total oneness of two persons. Notice that the author of this passage, who lived after the Babylonian exile, had a more advanced view on the dignity of the woman than many writers after him. He sees the woman as a suitable partner for the man, which clearly suggests equality. In today's Gospel our Lord refers to this passage. The Responsorial Psalm pictures an ideal marriage, one as it should be. Married people should never give up pursuing ideals!

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

The next seven Sundays we will read from the Letter to the Hebrews. Its author writes for Christians of Jewish background. He wants to strengthen their faith and to encourage them to grow with the Christians of Gentile origin into Christian maturity. The author refers to many details of Jewish worship (e.g., the Jewish high priest officiating in the Jerusalem temple), which his readers were familiar with and we can understand only if we read our Bible. This passage describes what Jesus has done for us Christians. God made "the leader [Jesus Christ] to [our] salvation perfect" (that is, he made him achieve his goal to save us) through his suffering on the cross.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

In this reading we have a section on marriage followed by a section on the family. As far as marriage is concerned, we should constantly search for the values that underlie the law of lasting fidelity. We should utilize all the means that nature, sound sexology, and religion indicate. They should be used to keep marriage an exciting event. By living the earthly reality of their marriage as it should be done, Christians should be a beacon for so many who waver in their commitments. As far as family life is concerned, children are part of marital fidelity and happiness. Accepting "the kingdom of God" in marriage presupposes some of the spontaneousness of love that children possess and grown-ups have so often lost.

The Story of Our Lady of the Rosary

Saint Pius V established the feast of Our Lady of Victory to thank God for the Christian defeat of the Turks at Lepanto—a victory attributed to praying the rosary. Pope Gregory XIII changed the name to Feast of the Holy Rosary—originally celebrated on the first Sunday in October—in 1573. Pope Clement XI extended the feast to the universal Church in 1716. And in 1913, Saint Pius X set the date for the feast that we know today of October 7.

The development of the rosary has a long history. First a practice developed of praying 150 Our Fathers in imitation of the 150 Psalms. Then there was a parallel practice of praying 150 Hail Mary's. Soon a mystery of Jesus' life was attached to each Hail Mary. Though Mary's giving of the rosary to Saint Dominic is recognized as a legend, the development of this prayer form owes much to the followers of Saint Dominic. One of them, Alan de la Roche, was known as "the apostle of the rosary." He founded the first Confraternity of the Rosary in the 15th century. In the 16th century, the rosary was developed to consist of 15 mysteries: joyful, sorrowful and glorious. In 2002, Pope John Paul II added the five Mysteries of Light to this devotion.

Reflection

The purpose of the rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation. Pius XII called it a compendium of the gospel. The main focus is on Jesus—his birth, life, death, and resurrection. The "Our Fathers" remind us that Jesus' Father is the initiator of salvation. The "Hail Mary's" remind us to join with Mary in contemplating these mysteries. They also make us aware that Mary was and is intimately joined with her Son in all the mysteries of his earthly and heavenly existence. The "Glory Bes" remind us that the purpose of all life is the glory of the Trinity.

The rosary appeals to many. It is simple. The constant repetition of words helps create an atmosphere in which to contemplate the mysteries of God. We sense that Jesus and Mary are with us in the joys and sorrows of life. We grow in hope that God will bring us to share in the glory of Jesus and Mary forever.
