

Renunciation and Stewardship - A song from the musical Godspell has these lines concerning Jesus of Nazareth: "See him more clearly, love him more dearly, follow him more nearly." Millions have done so over the centuries and countless others are still doing so today; and all have found the key to a meaningful life. In the Catholic tradition we know of two lifestyles in which Christians search for meaning and happiness. One of them is marriage, which is the life-style of most people. Facing life together, they try to see the Lord Jesus more clearly, love him more dearly, and follow him more nearly through the good stewardship of all the beauty and goodness of life that God has bestowed upon them. The other life-style, for those who are called to it, is "celibacy for the sake of the kingdom." It is a life of renunciation not as an end in itself but for a life of discipleship. If they are well understood, both life-styles should witness to the same Christian mystery, namely, God's kingdom of justice, love and peace as already initiated in human history. Todav's Scripture readings deal with the issue of life -style.

Lectio Divina

READ: Jesus was on his journey. A man ran up, asking Jesus about the things to be done to have eternal life. Jesus enumerated the commandments. The man said that he already obeyed all the commandments. Jesus looked at the man with love. He told the man the one thing the man still lacked. He challenged the man to go, sell his belongings, give the money to the poor and then come back in order to follow Jesus. The man went away sorrowful because of his great wealth. Then Jesus taught his disciples that it is hard for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God. It would be easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God. The disciples were astonished. Jesus further taught them that all things are possible with God. Peter answered that they left everything to follow Jesus. Jesus gave them the assurance of a hundredfold blessing and of eternal life.

REFLECT: Our commitment to follow Jesus is a commitment to a life of freedom. We are challenged to exercise the spirituality of detachment from enslaving material possessions. Wealth in itself is not bad but if wealth takes possession of us then it becomes a stumbling block that hinder us from following Jesus. Letting go is tantamount to letting God be God that he may set us free.

PRAY: Let us pray for God to set us free from our enslavement to material possessions.

ACT: Let us give away the things we do not use to those for whom they might be useful.

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

Figuratively, the author puts these words into the mouth of King Solomon. The king had asked for wisdom, which in Biblical language is not only learning but practical skill and insight as well. Actually, such wisdom stands for a good philosophy of life, which is worth more than health or comeliness, if one does not know how to live with either one prudently. The rich young man of the Gospel narrative did not understand this.

Wisdom is a gift of God for which we should pray: "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain wisdom of heart"

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

God's word to us insists on a decision. By their life-styles Christians should witness to real values that lead to happiness in Biblical terms, values that witness to the kingdom of God as initiated already here on earth.

Whether married or celibate for the sake of God's kingdom, our way of life should be marked by that all-penetrating word of God. Someday we must render an account!

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Apparently, the rich young man of this reading was searching for something. Jesus challenges him to a life of total renunciation, which he cannot accept. Peter and the Apostles have accepted it and Jesus gives his vision of this kind of life.

And what about those who are wealthy and do not feel able to live a life of renunciation? Can they be saved? It is difficult, because of the innumerable pitfalls. But "all things are possible for God." They should keep the commandments, in other words, exercise good stewardship.

Saint Luke's Story

Luke wrote one of the major portions of the New Testament, a two-volume work comprising the third Gospel and Acts of the Apostles. In the two books he shows the parallel between the life of Christ and that of the Church. He is the only Gentile Christian among the Gospel writers. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch, and Paul calls him "our beloved physician." His Gospel was probably written between 70 and 85 A.D.

Luke appears in Acts during Paul's second journey, remains at Philippi for several years until Paul returns from his third journey, accompanies Paul to Jerusalem, and remains near him when he is imprisoned in Caesarea. During these two years, Luke had time to seek information and interview persons who had known Jesus. He accompanied Paul on the dangerous journey to Rome where he was a faithful companion.

Luke's unique character may best be seen by the emphases of his Gospel, which has been given a number of subtitles:

- 1) The Gospel of Mercy
- 2) The Gospel of Universal Salvation
- 3) The Gospel of the Poor
- 4) The Gospel of Absolute Renunciation
- 5) The Gospel of Prayer and the Holy Spirit
- 6) The Gospel of Joy

Reflection

Luke wrote as a Gentile for Gentile Christians. His Gospel and Acts of the Apostles reveal his expertise in classic Greek style as well as his knowledge of Jewish sources. There is a warmth to Luke's writing that sets it apart from that of the other synoptic Gospels, and yet it beautifully complements those works. The treasure of the Scriptures is a true gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church.
