Meeting good persons may change our lives. Such persons may open our eyes to values we have overlooked. They may broaden our way of looking at things and encourage us when we are "down in the dumps." They may show us danger where we do not see it.

LECTIO DIVINA



READ: Jesus and his disciples came to Jericho. There was a blind man named Bartimaeus sitting by the roadside. When Bartimaeus heard that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by, he called out and asked Jesus to have mercy on him. Many tried to stop him but he shouted even louder. Jesus summoned Bartimaeus. He asked the blind man what he wanted Jesus to do to him. Bartimaeus answered that he wanted to see. Jesus told him that Bartimaeus could go his way. The blind man's faith made him well. Bartimaeus was cured and he followed Jesus on the road.

REFLECT: Mark 8: 27-10:45 is a unit where Jesus' teaching on discipleship patterned after the suffering Messiah could be found, framed by two healing miracle stories about Jesus who healed two different blind men: the blind man at Bethsaida and Bartimaeus. We may reflect on Bartimaeus' transformation not only in terms of the healing of his blindness but also in terms of his movement. Before he was cured by Jesus, Bartimaeus was described to be the blind man sitting by the roadside. Jesus cured him so he could see, following Jesus on the road. Bartimaeus is transformed from being a disabled person to becoming an ardent Jesus' follower. There are times when we prefer to remain sitting by the roadside even after encountering Jesus. We must follow Jesus on the road.

PRAY: Let us pray for divine empowerment that we may do our mission as Jesus' followers.

ACT: Let us do one act of charity to one of the persons we will meet today.

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

The setting is the long-awaited homecoming of the Israelites from their exile in Babylon. "Shout with joy for Jacob (Israel, God's people)." The author never lost trust in God that sometime or somehow he would heal the wounds of his people. The weak, lame and blind are with the returning exiles. God cares! The fact that "God cares" is also God's word to us now. "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy".

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

The author refers again to the Jewish high priest officiating in the temple of Jerusalem. He represents human beings to God by offering gifts and sacrifices. It is stated that Jesus is the high priest of the community and as such appointed by God. Jesus exercises his priesthood in heaven. Constantly referring to his sacrificial death on the cross, he pleads for mercy for all of us.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Mark wrote his Gospel to heal a certain "Christological blindness" in the Church of his day. Spectacular preachers, themselves a kind of miracle -workers and faith healers, had come along. They preached Jesus as a divine miracle-man and themselves as his successors. Mark did not find this picture of Jesus compatible with Jesus the one who as he really was: redeemed us by his suffering, death and resurrection. Hence, Mark describes Jesus' miracles as signs that indicate a spiritual reality. In the healing of the blind man the reality is the healing of a "Christological blindness," a blindness of mind that kept Mark's congregation from seeing Jesus as he really is.

All Saints' Day, also known as All Hallows' Day, the Feast of All Saints, the Feast of All Hallows, the Solemnity of All Saints, and Hallowmas, is a Christian solemnity celebrated in honour of all the saints of the Church, whether they are known or unknown. From the 4th century, <u>feasts</u> commemorating all Christian martyrs were held in various places, o n various dates near Easter and Pentecost. In the 9th century, some churches in the British Isles began holding the commemoration of all saints on 1 November, and in the 9th century this was extended to the whole Catholic Church by Pope Gregory IV. In Western Christianity, it is still celebrated on 1 November by the Roman Catholic Church as well as many Protestant churches, such t h e Lutheran, Anglican, and Methodist traditions. The Eastern Orthodox Church and associated Eastern Catholic and Eastern Lutheran churches celebrate it on the first Sunday after Pentecost. The Syro-Malabar Church and the Chaldean Catholic Church, both of which are in communion with Rome, as well as the Church of the East, celebrate All Saints' Day on the first Friday after Easter Sunday.

All Souls' Day, also called The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, is a day of prayer and remembrance for the faithful departed. observed by Christians on 2 November. Through prayer, intercessions, alms and visits to cemeteries, people commemorate the poor souls in purgatory and give the departed their favorite indulgences. In Western Christianity, including Roman Catholicism and certain parts of <u>Lutheranism</u> and <u>Anglicanism</u>, All Souls' Day is the third day of All hallow tide, after All Saints' Day (1 November) and All Hallows' Eve (31 October). Before the standardization of Western Christian observance on 2 November by St. Odilo of Cluny in the 10th century, many Catholic congregations celebrated All Souls' Day on various dates during the Easter season as it is still observed in some Eastern Orthodox Church, Eastern Catholic and Eastern Lutheran churches. Churches of the East Syriac Rite commemorate all the faithful departed on the Friday before Lent.
