#### Lectio Divina

**READ**: The Pharisees and some teachers of the law gathered around Jesus. They observed that Jesus' disciples were eating with unclean hands. The Pharisees, being Jews, would not eat without first washing their hands. Upon observing that Jesus' disciples were eating with unclean hands, the Pharisees and the teachers of the law questioned why Jesus' disciples were not following the tradition of the elders. Jesus answered them by quoting the prophet Isaiah on false worship, exposing their shallow understanding of God's commandments. It is not what enters a person that makes him/her unclean. What makes a person unclean are the things that come out of him/her.

**REFLECT**: Yesterday we reflected on the challenge of not wasting our talents. There are times when we are tempted to waste whatever God has given us. Moreover, there are also times when we are misled to use them for self-serving purposes. Our talents are useless if we do not use them well to serve others. Everything starts from within us, from having a heart that truly cares. In today's Gospel, the Pharisees and the teachers of the law were focusing on the external things because evil desires had already resided in their hearts. Jesus calls us to purity of heart. If our intentions are pure, the good use of our God-given talents will naturally follow.

PRAY: Let us pray that we may have pure hearts.

ACT: Let us do a more serious examination of conscience and then let go of any ungodly desires. Afterwards, let us do one concrete good act using our God-given talents.

#### WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

Meditating on the Law of Moses, the author of Deuteronomy saw the danger of human traditions, usually created by pious and well-intentioned churchmen. which could obscure the original will of God for his people. In your observance of the commandments of the Lord, "you shall not add to what I command you nor subtract from it." From the Gospel we learn that the Pharisees and experts of the law in Jesus' time had not heeded this advice of Deuteronomy too well. The Responsorial Psalm mentions a few things that cannot be done away with.

# WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

The sacred author stresses that the word of God is a genuine benefit from above, freely given by God. If this word is humbly welcomed in faith, it will save us. But we should do more than just listen to God's word. We should also live it.

# WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

This passage, as we have it now in Mark, consists of two pronouncements. In the first one Jesus castigates the experts of the law for the countless human-made traditions they want the faithful to follow. "You disregard God's commandment [love for God and neighbor?] but cling to human tradition." In the second pronouncement, Jesus refers to the human-made dietary laws of the Jewish Religion, the prohibition of certain foods (e.g., pork) that would make people impure and not fit to partake in cultic worship. In the early Church, Christians of Jewish origin tried to impose these in the early Church laws on Christians of Gentile background! Mark does not agree and refers to Jesus' statement that only what comes out of people (evil words and actions) makes them unclean. In both cases, Jesus stresses the relativity of human tradition versus the divine elements in religion. What is your attitude toward Church renewal?

#### DID YOU KNOW: --

Pope Gregory I (Latin: Gregorius I; c. 540 – 12 March 604), commonly known as Saint Gregory the Great, was the 64th Bishop of Rome from 3 September 590 to his death. He is known for instituting the first recorded large-scale mission from Rome, the Gregorian mission, to convert the then largely pagan Anglo-Saxons to Christianity. Gregory is also well known for his writings, which were more prolific than those of any of his predecessors as pope. The epithet Saint Gregory the Dialogist has been attached to him in Eastern Christianity because of his Dialogues.

Gregory was born into a wealthy noble Roman family with close connections to the church. His father, Gordianus, a patrician who served as a senator and for a time was the Prefect of the City of Rome, also held the position of Regionarius in the church, though nothing further is known about that position. Gregory's mother, Silvia, was well-born, and had a married sister, Pateria, in Sicily. His mother and two paternal aunts, Trasilla and Emiliana, are honored by Catholic and Orthodox churches as saints. Gregory's grandfather had been Pope Felix III, the nominee of the Gothic king, Theodoric. Gregory's election to the throne of St. Peter made his family the most distinguished clerical dynasty of the period.

A Roman senator's son and himself the prefect of Rome at 30, Gregory lived in a monastery that he established on his family estate before becoming a papal ambassador and then pope. Before becoming Pope, he challenged the theological views of Patriarch Eutychius of Constantinople before the emperor Tiberius II. Although he was the first pope from a monastic background, his prior political experiences may have helped him to be a talented administrator. During his papacy, his administration greatly surpassed that of the emperors in improving the welfare of the people of Rome.
