"Can We Stand Correction?"

"Leave me alone! Mind your own business!" is the usual reaction when others interfere with our way of life. We want to be happy in our own little world, with our good and perhaps also bad habits!

Children do not like to be corrected by parents or teachers. Grown-ups unduly resent their employers' attempts to enhance their working methods. Parishioners may concede that priests should preach on sin, but they do not want them to go into details in which the audience may be involved! And in the "closed society" of the South in the sixties, people who came in to encourage blacks to stand up for their rights were termed "outside agitators." They were told: "Go home and leave us alone!"

Today's Second Reading compares life with a race course. We should persevere in running the race of life. But no team is going to succeed without a coach who observes every player and corrects the technique of each. Can we stand honest correction? The First Reading and Gospel tell us about Jeremiah and Jesus of Nazareth, who did not leave people alone. In the name of God, they had to speak. Their sermons were corrective and aimed at restoring life as it should be!



LECTIO DIVINA



"Christ & His Word Are The Fire That Enlightens & Purifies.."

Read: Jeremiah's words are perceived as a threat rather than a means to save the people, and so he is thrown into a muddy cistern to die. Hebrews encourages us to rid ourselves of everything that is contrary to the Gospel, and Jesus declares that he has come to set the world alight with his Word.

Reflect: Sometimes the truth is unwelcome news. Good intentions are misconstrued as meddling, or worse, they are seen as having an ulterior. self-serving motive. Likewise, the Good News of Jesus Christ can be an unwelcome call to a different way of life, which can lead to division in families and communities. However, the division occasioned by acceptance or rejection of the Good News is not to bring about a breakdown in society. Rather, it is a catalyst to change, leading people to question the meaning of their existence, instead of remaining indifferent. And so, Christ and his Word are the fire that enlightens and purifies rather than destroys and breaks apart.

Pray: Meditate upon the situations of strife in your family life, your work, community or church. Ask for the openness to accept the truth and to stay true to Christ's transforming way of love despite opposition.

Act: Be Christ's instrument of change in your community by your acts of faith, justice and love.

WHAT THE FIRST READING **SAYS TO ME**

Jeremiah the prophet ("spokesman of God") corrected the power structure of his society. Israel was God's chosen people, living with him in a sacred partnership (covenant). He wanted those in power to realize this, but they did not like to be corrected by the man of God.

This reading prepares us to understand today's Gospel in which lesus predicts his passion and death. Suffering and endurance is part of each serious Christian's life, and faith in God should help us to stand it. "Though I am afflicted and poor, yet the Lord thinks of me"

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Wherever the ancient Romans built cities, one finds the ruins of an amphitheater. They loved the games. This passage uses sporting language to encourage us not to follow the easy way as Christians but rather to make even painful decisions, if necessary (Gospel). Life is the arena of the local amphitheater. A cloud of witnesses/ spectators watches us. Sins are hindering clothes. Take them off when you are running.

Keep your eyes fixed on Jesus. As a good coach, he inspires and perfects your faith and self-confidence. And he gives the reason for your efforts, namely, the joy of heaven. He himself endured the opposition of sinners (Gospel). The lesson for you and me is: Do not abandon the struggle!

WHAT THE GOSPEL **SAYS TO ME**

"There is a baptism with which I must be baptized." Jesus refers to "baptism by immersion." In other words, he says: "I will be immersed in pain and death." And he shows that he is human by feeling anguish!

Jesus could not conceive of himself as running a popularity contest. Those who follow him must be willing to make even painful decisions. "Avoiding the occasion of sin" could be such a decision!

Saint of the Day - August 21st, 2025 Saint Pius X's Story

Pope Pius X is perhaps best remembered for his encouragement of the frequent reception of Holv Communion. especially by children.

The second of 10 children in a poor Italian family, Joseph Sarto became Pius X at age 68. He was one of the 20th century's greatest popes.

Ever mindful of his humble origin, Pope Pius stated, "I was born poor, I lived poor, I will die poor." He was embarrassed by some of the pomp of the papal court. "Look how they have dressed me up," he said in tears to an old friend. To another, "It is a penance to be forced to accept all these practices. They lead me around surrounded by soldiers like Jesus when he was seized in Gethsemani."

Interested in politics, Pope Pius encouraged Italian Catholics to become more politically involved. One of his first papal acts was to end the supposed right of governments to interfere by veto in papal elections—a practice that reduced the freedom of the 1903 conclave which had elected him.

In 1905, when France renounced its agreement with the Holy See and threatened confiscation of Church property if governmental control of Church affairs were not granted, Pius X courageously rejected the demand.

While he did not author a famous social encyclical as his predecessor had done, he denounced the ill treatment of indigenous peoples on the plantations of Peru, sent a relief commission to Messina after an earthquake, and sheltered refugees at his own expense.

On the 11th anniversary of his election as pope. Europe was plunged into World War I. Pius had foreseen it, but it killed him. "This is the last affliction the Lord will visit on me. I would gladly give my life to save my poor children from this ghastly scourge." He died a few weeks after the war began, and was canonized in 1954.
