Christian Love Guided by Faith

In observing the animal world, we can be touched by the apparent affection a female is able to give to her puppies. But it shocks us when we see how cruel that same animal can be to other animals that are not her offspring. Seemingly a woman has the same affectionate love for her baby. The instinctive emotional part of love is apparently the same. But there is a great difference. Human love is not merely emotional. It also contains an element of insight. Besides loving her own baby, a mother also loves other children. This element of insight is even more decisive when love is elevated from the mere human level to the sacred, namely, Christian love, called charity. The insight that guides charity is faith. Today's Liturgy deals with love of God and all human beings regardless of race, creed or color. Paying attention to the insight of faith, which guides it, is important.

LECTIO DIVINA



"All people are worthy of being loved."

Read: Deuteronomy teaches that God's law is not beyond our reach or comprehension, since God has written it, his commandments in our hearts, commandments which are summed up in love of God and neighbour. In this parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus explains that the love of neighbour is universal in its application. Jesus himself shows us a universal love by dying for all and in him all things hold together through that love.

Reflect: The parable of the Good Samaritan powerfully demonstrates that all people are worthy of being loved, regardless of race, religion or circumstance, and the parable prompts us to ask ourselves, "What is my response to people in need? Do I stop and offer help, or do I pass by? That help may be direct involvement, indirect support through contribution to charities, trained and skilled in helping the hungry, the sick, the homeless or any other physical or emotional need. The whole focus of the parable is the call to have eyes to see the needs of others and a heart that is willing to love, because if we fail in loving our neighbour, how can we be sincere in loving God?

Pray: Pray for a heart that is more open to others.

Act: Reach out to someone who needs your support or help.



WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME

The Book of Deuteronomy (which means "Second Law") is a series of sermons or meditations on the Law of Moses. This passage seems to have been composed during the exile in Babylon. The author lets Moses speak figuratively. We should heed the voice of the Lord. It is not far away. It is in your heart. In Christian terminology, follow your informed conscience, through which God speaks to you.

This reading prepares us to listen to the Gospel, which deals with God's commandments. Make the Responsorial Psalm your prayer when you need guidance in life.

WHAT THE 2ND READING SAYS TO ME

We have read in the "Wisdom literature" of the Bible that Wisdom in God was personified and seen as an agent through whom God had created the world and preserved it. Paul sees God's Wisdom incarnated in Jesus Christ. God revealing himself and acting in Jesus is the same God who creates and preserves the universe. Hence, creation is basically good though corrupted by evils. Christ's task was to restore things, "to reconcile all things for him." In baptized Christians God's design has been restored; we are reconciled with God "by the blood of his cross."

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Jesus' commandment of love of God and neighbor is actually a combination of Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 9:18. We cannot love God without loving our neighbor, nor conversely is love of neighbor possible without love of God. The insight of faith helps us to see the reason why. Faith tells us that all human beings are God's children. He loves all of them. You cannot possibly love parents and exclude their children from your love. The other way around, faith tells us that what you do for the least of your brothers you do for God.

Love of God must motivate you; otherwise you will confine your love to those you like, and eventually behave like the priest and Levite in the Parable of the Good Samaritan. Being a good Samaritan requires faith, which tells me that all people, regardless of race, creed, or color, are brothers and sisters of one heavenly Father.

Saint of the Day - July 16th, 2025 The Story of Our Lady of Mount Carmel

Hermits lived on Mount Carmel near the Fountain of Elijah in northern Israel in the 12th century. They had a chapel dedicated to Our Lady. By the 13th century they became known as "Brothers of Our Lady of Mount Carmel." They soon celebrated a special Mass and Office in honor of Mary. In 1726, it became a celebration of the universal Church under the title of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. For centuries the Carmelites have seen themselves as specially related to Mary. Their great saints and theologians have promoted devotion to her and often championed the mystery of her Immaculate Conception.

Saint Teresa of Avila called Carmel "the Order of the Virgin." Saint John of the Cross credited Mary with saving him from drowning as a child, leading him to Carmel, and helping him escape from prison. Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus believed that Mary cured her from illness. On her First Communion day, Thérèse dedicated her life to Mary. During the last days of her life she frequently spoke of Mary.

There is a tradition—which may not be historical—that Mary appeared to Saint Simon Stock, a leader of the Carmelites, and gave him a scapular, telling him to promote devotion to it. The scapular is a modified version of Mary's own garment. It symbolizes her special protection and calls the wearers to consecrate themselves to her in a special way. The scapular reminds us of the gospel call to prayer and penance—a call that Mary models in a splendid way.

Reflection

The Carmelites were known from early on as "Brothers of Our Lady of Mount Carmel." The title suggests that they saw Mary not only as "mother," but also as "sister." The word sister is a reminder that Mary is very close to us. She is the daughter of God and therefore can help us be authentic daughters and sons of God. She also can help us grow in appreciation of being sisters and brothers to one another. She leads us to a new realization that all human beings belong to the family of God. When such a conviction grows, there is hope that the human race can find its way to peace.
