### LECTIO DIVINA



**Read:** Acts describes the dramatic gift of the Holy Spirit, whose power is experienced as wind and fire. Saint Paul says our different spiritual gifts are to be used in collaboration for God's service. The Risen Christ greets the Apostles and he breathes on them, giving them the Holy Spirit to be instruments of peace and forgiveness.

**Reflect:** The Holy Spirit is as essential as the air we breathe. But like the air we often take the Spirit for granted. Pentecost reminds us how important the Holy Spirit is for our lives and for our We breathe in Christian vocations. different ways: not only breathing imperceptibly, but also taking deep breaths when necessary, such as when something challenging, swimming underwater, or something joyous, like singing. So also, the Spirit is given to us in special ways at special moments, if we ask. The Spirit is unity, charity and truth and calls us to live as the Church in unity, charity and truth, and as individuals who care for others, sharing the love of God.

**Pray:** Notice your breathing and thank God for the gift of life. Meditate on the breath of God, thank the Holy Spirit for all his gifts and guidance.

**Act:** This is a glorious feast - celebrate it with family and friends!

They are a year of the Lord's favor which instills in our hearts the certain hope of salvation in our lives and the world in Jesus Christ. The Jubilee of the Year 2025, with its invitation to be renewed in this hope, is likewise a powerful testament to the transformative power of a genuine encounter with the saving love and liberating truth of the Lord Iesus.

In a special way, the dedication and energy of those involved in Ecclesial Movements, Associations and New Communities across our dioceses and archdioceses embody that living presence of Christ in our world, fostering a deeper sense of solidarity, communion and spiritual renewal. The unwavering dedication and service of these faithful men and women shine as beacons of hope, illuminating the path of faith for countless people throughout our nation and world.

This Jubilee Year also provides a unique opportunity to recognize and celebrate the distinct ministries, charisms, and gifts of the Holy Spirit that these movements and communities bring to the Church. Their diverse expressions of faith and commitment enrich the spiritual tapestry of our dioceses, offering fresh perspectives and innovative approaches to evangelization and pastoral care. By embracing their unique contributions, we celebrate the unity in diversity that is a hallmark of the mystical Body of Christ that is the Catholic Church, acknowledging that each movement and community, regardless of its size or influence, plays a vital role in the Church's mission.

### **KEY SAINTS**

Holy Companions for Ecclesial Movements, Associations and New Communities.

- Mary, Queen of the Apostles (can be celebrated at Pentecost), through whom Jesus Christ was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit (see Luke 1:26-38), joins in prayer with the Apostles in the Upper Room (the Cenacle) at Pentecost, where the outpouring of the Holy Spirit occurred, and the Church began her mission in the world (see Acts 2:1-47).
- St. Francis of Assisi (1181-1226, feast day October 4), patron of the Franciscan order and spirituality, Catholic Action, people living in poverty, ecology, animals, and Italy. His exemplary life of simplicity, pastoral care, and community has inspired many associations of the faithful movements, and new communities.
- ♦ St. Vincent Pallotti (1795-1850, feast day January 22), Italian founder of the Union of the Catholic Apostolate and the Society of the Catholic Apostolate (in 1835), who believed that all (ordained, consecrated, and lay alike) are called to be apostles, coresponsible for the Church's mission.
- Servant of God Chiara Lubich (1920-2008), Italian lay teacher, author, and founder of the Focolare Movement; recognized by UNESCO, which awarded her the Prize for Peace Education in 1996.

#### WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME

The Bible, especially the New Testament, should never be read in the past tense. It is God's word to you and me now! Jesus is alive, His Spirit is with every Christian. This is the meaning of the Christ event, meaningfully celebrated at Easter, Ascension, and Pentecost, three aspects of the one mystery.

Luke Follows the early Christian custom of celebrating the communication of the Spirit at the conclusion of the "great fifty days," our Pentecost. Hence, he relates the outpouring of the Spirit as we have it in the First Reading. John puts the communication of the Spirit on Easter Day . The gift of the Spirit is one with the risen Lord Jesus. Notice that both traditions stress that the Christian message is not just for the Jews but for all people.

#### WHAT THE 2ND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul is concerned about his congregation in Corinth. In it, a charismatic group has originated and glossolalia (speaking in tongues) is practiced. Its effect on the congregation has not been good. Those who have failed to participate are looked upon as second-class Christian and divisiveness has ensued. Paul does not condemn the movement. He sees in it the Spirit at work. But on the other hand he stresses that the outpouring of the Spirit must build up the community (the Body of Christ), not tear it apart.

To have the Spirit means, first of all, to confess: "Jesus is Lord." This is done in various ways, not just by speaking in tongues. Each gift, even the Least spectacular one, must be used for the common good! This could be a reminder to contemporary movements and countermovements in the Church.

#### WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Sometimes this reading is called "the Pentecost according to John." The theological background has been explained above. Notice that Jesus uses the symbolism of "breathing," When he communicates his Spirit to the disciples. Breath was the sign of life for the ancient Hebrews, and we ourselves still practice mouth to mouth resuscitation in a case of emergency.

This symbolism of "breathing" reminds us also of the first verse of the Bible, where the "Ruah Yahweh" (breath-spirit of the Creator-God) is mentioned as the life-giving and animating principle of all creation. Jesus was a Jew and as such deeply steeped in Hebrew literature and culture.

**Feast Day** - June 9th *Mary, Mother of the Church* 

Taking into consideration the close ties by which Mary and the Church are bound together, to the glory of the Blessed Virgin and for our consolation, We declare Mary Most Holy to be Mother of the Church, that is, of the whole Christian people, faithful and Pastors alike, who invoke her as their most loving Mother; and We establish that by this sweetest of names the whole Christian people should henceforth give still greater honor to the Mother of God and offer her their supplications.

Venerable Brothers, this concerns a title by no means new to Christian piety; indeed the Christian faithful and the universal Church choose to invoke Mary principally by the name of Mother. In truth, this name belongs to the genuine nature of devotion to Mary, since it rests firmly on that very dignity with which Mary is endowed as the Mother of the Incarnate Word of God.

Iust as the Divine Motherhood is the basis both for Mary's unique relationship with Christ and for her presence in the work of human salvation accomplished by Christ Jesus, so likewise, it is principally from the Divine Motherhood that the relationships which exist between Mary and the Church flow. Mary is indeed the Mother of Christ who, at the moment he assumed human nature in her virginal womb, joined to himself, as Head, his Mystical Body, which is the Church. Mary, therefore, as Mother of Christ, must also be regarded as Mother of all the faithful and Pastors alike, that is to say, of the Church.

Herein lies the reason why we, though unworthy and weak, yet in a spirit of trust and with ardent filial love, raise our eyes to her. She who once gave us Jesus, the fount of heavenly grace, cannot fail to offer her maternal help to the Church, especially at this time in which the Spouse of Christ strives with greater zeal to fulfil her salvific mission.
