LECTIO DIVINA



"The Trinity is a communion of love"

Read: The first reading describes the creative power of divine Wisdom, an image which points to the Son of God. The Son was there with the Father at creation and is the means of the Father's saving plan. We have hope in eternal life through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Reflect: We begin our Mass, we baptize, we give blessings, all in the name of the Most Holy Trinity. The Trinity is fundamental to our Christian faith. It's said that Christopher Columbus began every letter and every adventure in the name of the Trinity. On his third voyage in 1498, he vowed to consecrate the first land he would discover to the Trinity. Its name has remained Trinidad ever since. May the feast of the Trinity deepen our faith in the Triune God and, like Columbus, inspire us to dedicate our plans, adventures and daily living to the God who made us, redeemed us and sanctifies us.

Pray: Pray the Glory be slowly. Pray other prayers in honour of the Most Holy Trinity.

Act: The Trinity is a communion of love. We are to imitate that communion in the way we deal with other people, who are made in the image and likeness of God. Share some time with friends today or devote some time to praying for others.

SPORTS MINISTRY

Sports have been part of the Christian experience since the beginning of the Church, as athletes were among the first Christians. Successive popes and Catholic leaders in recent history have also encouraged the integration of the Gospel in the world of sports. Various organizations such as Catholic Athletes for Christ were established to help give Catholic support to athletes, coaches, and sports ministers.

A CATHOLIC ATHLETE'S GUIDE TO ENGAGING IN HOLINESS AND EVANGELIZATION.

The following can be a list of guiding principles for any Catholic athlete, as well as manager, coach, or family member connected to the world of sports, who seeks to engage more deeply in a life of holiness and evangelization in his or her journey to and through the Jubilee Holy Year in 2025.

- ⇒ The Catholic athlete is part of the evangelizing mission of the Catholic Church. The Catholic athlete opens themselves to the indwelling of the Holy Trinity in their souls in prayer and allows the Holy Trinity to guide them on their Catholic athletic ecclesial mission to bring a spirit of holiness and virtue to the local and global sports world.
- ⇒ Catholic athletes are grounded in the liberating truths of Catholic theology and spirituality and are committed to deepening their understanding and capacity to share their Catholic faith intellectually and spiritually.
- ⇒ All Catholics are called to be dedicated to the Catholic formation of our Catholic coaches and Catholic athletes and to developing a refined spirit of ecumenism and inter-faith charity that inspires the non-Catholic coaches and athletes we work and pray with.

KEY SAINTS - HOLY COMPANIONS FOR ATHLETES, COACHES, AND FANS

- ⇒ St. Joseph the Worker (first century, feast days March 19 and May 1), foster father of Jesus and spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary; he completely dedicated himself to service to the Holy Family through his strength and resilience, serving as the Lord's father figure in Jesus.
- ⇒ St. Sebastian (third century, feast day January 20), strong young captain of the Praetorian Guard during the reign of the Roman Emperor Diocletian, yet secretly provided aid to persecuted Christians. "Martyred twice," once by being shot with arrows (yet survived and nursed back to health), then beaten to death by cudgels.
- ⇒ St. John Paul II (1920-2005, feast day October 22), skier, kayaker, hiker, fisherman, and outdoorsman, spoke frequently on the power of sports to help in the development of young people's faith.

WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME

God has created the universe by his infinite Wisdom. The universe is "the work of [his] fingers". In this passage God's Wisdom is introduced to us as a person. Later John will speak of God's Wisdom as Word of God and Light of God.

We learn how the ancient Hebrews experienced God's Wisdom in creation. We should follow that example. "O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!".

WHAT THE 2ND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul describes how afflicted persons can experience God Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in their lives. Whatever happens, in faith we know that we are at peace with God through Jesus Christ, who died for our sins. We have hope in God, and the Holy Spirit, given to us in baptism, is the pledge of God's fidelity.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

John does not teach the doctrine of the Blessed Trinity explicitly. But he speaks of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Father is the origin of all creation. We experience him through Jesus Christ, who is his Wisdom, Word, Light, and perfect Image. And the Spirit, who proceeds from both, will guide us to all truth.

The apostles did not have a complete understanding of their mission when our Lord left them visibly. But his Spirit was to guide them. Similarly, we need the Holy Spirit to guide us on our path through life.

Saint of the Day - June 21st Saint Aloysius Gonzaga's Story

The Lord can make saints anywhere, even amid the brutality and license of Renaissance life. Florence was the "mother of piety" for Aloysius Gonzaga despite his exposure to a "society of fraud, dagger, poison, and lust." As a son of a princely family, he grew up in royal courts and army camps. His father wanted Aloysius to be a military hero.

At age 7 Aloysius experienced a profound spiritual quickening. His prayers included the Office of Mary, the psalms, and other devotions. At age 9 he came from his hometown of Castiglione to Florence to be educated; by age 11 he was teaching catechism to poor children, fasting three days a week, and practicing great austerities. When he was 13 years old, he traveled with his parents and the Empress of Austria to Spain, and acted as a page in the court of Philip II. The more Aloysius saw of court life, the more disillusioned he became, seeking relief in learning about the lives of saints.

A book about the experience of Jesuit missionaries in India suggested to him the idea of entering the Society of Jesus, and in Spain his decision became final. Now began a four-year contest with his father. Eminent churchmen and laypeople were pressed into service to persuade Aloysius to remain in his "normal" vocation. Finally he prevailed, was allowed to renounce his right to succession, and was received into the Jesuit novitiate.

Like other seminarians, Aloysius was faced with a new kind of penance—that of accepting different ideas about the exact nature of penance. He was obliged to eat more, and to take recreation with the other students. He was forbidden to pray except at stated times. He spent four years in the study of philosophy and had Saint Robert Bellarmine as his spiritual adviser.
