Jubilee of Volunteering

8th - 9th March 2025

WHO IS A VOLUNTEER? WHAT IS VOLUNTEERING?

This word has many meanings in Catholic settings. Each diocese/eparchy or parish can establish parameters for what it exactly means for each context, but here are a few thoughts about who can be included within the broad category of "volunteering." This is not an exclusive list, but may spark your own creativity:

- ◆ Parishioners who volunteer for one or more of the ministries in a parish community (i.e., liturgical ministers, church council members, children's catechists, musicians or choir members, food pantry support, soup kitchen, Knights of Columbus, altar servers, non-paid ministry coordinators, etc.).
- ◆ Lay Catholics who give of their time and giftedness to the civic community (i.e., docents, volunteer firefighters, community clean-up work, non-paid assisted living support, those who assist with secular poverty programs and shelters, those who coordinate community social events, etc.).
- ◆ Lay Catholics who are active on the regional, national, or global level through volunteer based service and/or mission organizations (i.e., Catholic Volunteer Network, Catholic Charities, Catholic Relief Services, Jesuit Volunteer Corps, Glenmary, Maryknoll, Nazareth Farm, Amate House, Habitat for Humanity, Appalachia Service Project, AmeriCorps, Teach for America, Greenpeace, Mercy Volunteer Corps, Franciscan Mission Service, Salesian Lay Missioners, etc.).

The heart of a volunteer exudes a generous devotion to service for others and the mission of the Gospel. In upholding the dignity of every person, volunteers are stewards of the gifts God has given them to advance the work of the Church, to alleviate human suffering, or to contribute to the transformation of the world.

A FEW KEY SAINTS & BLESSEDS - Holy Companions for Lay Volunteers

- St. Zita (1212-1272, feast day April 27), patron of single laywomen, domestic workers, and service work; well-known for humility, meekness, and generosity, she was a domestic servant for a rich Italian household while also spending additional time serving the poor and sick in their homes in the community.
- Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925, feast day July 4), lay volunteer, athlete, student, activist, member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic, beloved among the poor and marginalized, and declared the "Man of the Beatitudes"; engaged in regular acts of Christian charity, service, and support, especially for the sick and dying people of Turin, Italy. Died of polio at young adult age of 25 while ministering to polio victims.
- Bl. Michael McGivney (1852-1890, feast day August 13), founder of the Knights of Columbus (in 1882) and filled with a "zeal for the proclamation of the Gospel and generous concern for his brothers and sisters" that "made him an outstanding witness of Christian solidarity and fraternal assistance."

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

This reading is a "Eucharistic Confession," confession a thanksgiving. It is taken from the ritual prescribed for the feast of the harvest thanksgiving. "My father was a wandering Aramean...." Jacob (Israel), perpetually seeking pasture for his flock, ended up in Egypt where his clan first enjoyed prosperity and later was enslaved. Notice that the Exodus from Egypt "with terrifying power, with signs and wonders," has for the Jews a meaning similar to what the death and resurrection of our Lord Iesus Christ means to us Christians. Both are mighty acts of God resulting in liberation. Both inspire a Confession of Faith in which these mighty acts are recited. "Say to the Lord, 'My refuge and fortress, my God in whom I trust'".

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

This reading contains a baptismal Confession: "If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord,... you will be saved." Our Confession of Faith at baptism is now more elaborate, but the very core of it is that God has raised the Lord Jesus Christ from the dead and made him Lord. Pay special attention to your Profession of Faith during this worship service!

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Luke uses this tradition about our Lord to describe the temptations of the early Church. Notice the Confession: "One does not live on bread alone. You shall worship the Lord your God, and him alone shall you serve..... You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." Jesus was tempted to give up his vocation, the Church is tempted time and again to be unfaithful to her original calling, and we as individuals are tempted as well. We should be a "confessing" Church. Others should know clearly what we stand for. Could the above Confession of Faith inspire you during the week to come?

What is Lent?

Wednesday, March 5, 2025 -Thursday, April 17, 2025

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other the throughout season. Contemplate the meaning and origins of the Lenten fasting tradition in this reflection. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's giftsnot only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.
