Jubilee 2025

24 Hours for the Lord 28th March

Pope Francis has chosen a meaningful theme for the 12th edition of 24 Hours for the Lord, held in the context of the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025: "You are my hope" (Ps 71:5). This theme reflects the heart of the Jubilee Year, inspired by "Spes non confundit"—"Hope does not disappoint" (Rom 5:5). Throughout this Holy Year, the Church invites the faithful to become "Pilgrims of Hope," seeking renewal through God's mercy.

What is 24 Hours for the Lord?

This worldwide initiative highlights the sacrament of reconciliation as central to the life of the Church. It is a time set apart to experience God's mercy, reminding the faithful that in confession, they do not face a judge but a loving Father who welcomes, consoles and offers the grace of renewal. As Pope Francis has said, "Mercy gives rise to joy, because our hearts are opened to the hope of a new life" (Misericordia et misera, No. 3).

How Can You Participate?

On Friday, March 28, through Saturday, March 29, parishes worldwide are encouraged to open their doors for 24 hours, offering extended opportunities for confession, preferably in a setting of Eucharistic adoration. Many communities will begin with a Liturgy of the Word on Friday evening, preparing the faithful for reconciliation, and conclude with anticipated Sunday Mass on Saturday afternoon.

This initiative calls all Catholics to rediscover the power of confession and place God's mercy at the center of their lives. The 2025 Jubilee of Hope is an invitation to renewal—an opportunity to step forward as Pilgrims of Hope, strengthened by the love and forgiveness of God.

A handbook has been prepared for the Jubilee Year with suggestions to help parishes and Christian communities organize this event. While providing guidance, it allows for flexibility to adapt to local traditions and needs.

Father in heaven, may the faith you have given us in your Son, Jesus Christ, our brother and the flame of charity enkindled in our hearts by the Holy Spirit, reawaken in us the blessed hope for the coming of your Kingdom. May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, a yearning for the treasures of heaven. May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. To you our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise for ever. Amen

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

In constantly reforming our lives, we must check where God fits into our set of values. The tradition found in this reading teaches that God is not far away. Moses experienced him in the situation of the desert. Last week the image of "a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch" was used to teach about God's presence. Today it is again fire that symbolizes God's closeness. By using this imagery, the Old Testament teaches exactly the same thing that Paul taught in concise language: "In him [God] we live and move and have our being". Moses experienced God as "One who cares," and during his life he grew in intimacy with God. An example to be followed! Meditate on God's closeness and care by reading the Responsorial Psalm.

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul indicates how we should read the Bible. The sacred writers did not relate ancient traditions just to inform us. Neither does the Church want us to listen to them every three years in order to entertain us. The Bible is not a bedside story book! Inspired by God, the authors of the Bible want to teach us religious values by relating traditions of the past. In this passage, Paul refers to some events, as he knew them from the Old Testament, and observes: "These things happened as examples for us.... They have been written down as a warning to us." In reading the Bible, we should always try to find the point (God's word to us) and apply it prayerfully to our own situation.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

This Gospel tradition refers to violent reprisals by the Romans who occupied Israel during Jesus' lifetime. There were constant uprisings on the part of the Jewish people that finally culminated in the wholesale destruction of Jerusalem in 70 A.D. According to popular thinking, disaster and suffering were caused by sin. Jesus corrects this way of thinking, but takes these incidents as a stepping-stone to teach about penance and reform using the parable of the fig tree to illustrate his lesson. This lesson is God's word to you and me. Check your priority of values and ask yourself where God fits in! Stating that everything is all right means stating that you are "old" and not growing anymore as a person. We need constantly ongoing reform and growth into what God has designed us to be for all eternity.

The Story of the Annunciation of the Lord

19th March, 2025

The feast of the Annunciation, now recognized as a solemnity, was first celebrated in the fourth or fifth century. Its central focus is the Incarnation: God has become one of us. From all eternity God had decided that the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity should become human. Now, as Luke 1:26-38 tells us, the decision is being realized. The God-Man embraces all humanity, indeed all creation, to bring it to God in one great act of love. Because human beings have rejected God, Jesus will accept a life of suffering and an agonizing death: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13).

Mary has an important role to play in God's plan. From all eternity, God destined her to be the mother of Jesus and closely related to him in the creation and redemption of the world. We could say that God's decrees of creation and redemption are joined in the decree of Incarnation. Because Mary is God's instrument in the Incarnation, she has a role to play with Jesus in creation and redemption. It is a God-given role. It is God's grace from beginning to end. Mary becomes the eminent figure she is only by God's grace. She is the empty space where God could act. Everything she is she owes to the Trinity.

Mary is the virgin-mother who fulfills Isaiah 7:14 in a way that Isaiah could not have imagined. She is united with her son in carrying out the will of God (Psalm 40:8-9; Hebrews 10:7-9; Luke 1:38).

Together with Jesus, privileged and graced Mary is the link between heaven and earth. She is the human being who best, after Jesus, exemplifies the possibilities of human existence. She received into her lowliness the infinite love of God. She shows how an ordinary human being can reflect God in the ordinary circumstances of life. She exemplifies what the Church and every member of the Church is meant to become. She is the ultimate product of the creative and redemptive power of God. She manifests what the Incarnation is meant to accomplish for all of us.
