Missionaries of Mercy 28th - 30th March

The Holy See has designated a number of Jubilee Days throughout 2025 to recognize and celebrate different groups of people and various ministries in the Church. The Jubilee of the Missionaries of Mercy will be March 28-30, 2025; however, these resources can be used for engaging and celebrating the Missionaries of Mercy at any time throughout the Jubilee Year. These resources might serve as an inspiration and reflection material for the Missionaries of Mercy in preparation for their Jubilee and for the creation and development of other resources.

Key Saints

Saints Who Inspire the Missionaries of Mercy

The Missionaries of Mercy are called to be living witnesses of God's boundless mercy. Throughout history, the Church has been blessed with saints whose lives exemplify compassion, forgiveness, and evangelization. These holy men and women serve as models and intercessors for those entrusted with the ministry of mercy.

Saints of Divine Mercy and Confession

- St. Faustina Kowalska (1905–1938, feast day October 5) The Apostle of Divine Mercy, who received the revelations of Jesus recorded in her Diary, inspiring the devotion to the Divine Mercy.
- St. John Vianney (1786–1859, feast day August 4) The Curé of Ars, known for spending countless hours in the confessional, leading souls to reconciliation with God.
- St. Leopold Mandic (1866–1942, feast day May 12) A Capuchin friar dedicated to the sacrament of reconciliation, renowned for his gentle and compassionate approach to penitents. Missionary Saints of Mercy
- St. Francis Xavier (1506–1552, feast day December 3) A tireless Jesuit missionary who brought the Gospel to Asia, embodying mercy through evangelization and service.
- St. Damien of Molokai (1840–1889, feast day May 10) The priest who ministered to lepers in Hawaii, offering them dignity and the love of Christ.
- St. Teresa of Calcutta (1910–1997, feast day September 5) Founder of the Missionaries of Charity, who saw the face of Christ in the poor and abandoned

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

In the promised land, the Hebrews celebrated the Passover. Their motivation was not to get something. They offered their lambs as a sign of gratitude to Almighty God. Our Passover Lamb is Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

Note that the setting of our weekly Passover is the Eucharistic Prayer, a prayer of thanksgiving and praise, and these sentiments should be your motivation for taking part in it. "We offer you [God] in thanksgiving this holy and living sacrifice Through him [Jesus Christ), with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever".

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

The message of this reading is that God, in Christ, has reconciled us to himself. Apply this to yourself. Whether you are "the prodigal son" or "the righteous son" of today's Gospel, you need reconciliation, which is not bought with good works, but given freely!

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

We note first that the popular name of this parable, "The Prodigal Son," is misleading. The parable of "The Merciful Father" would be a better name. It is all about "a man," called "father" thirteen times and obviously representing Almighty God, who cares for both the son who ran off and the law-abiding son who remained home.

Luke indicates those to whom the parable is directed: the tax collectors and sinners (the son who ran off), and the Pharisees and scribes, the righteous observers of the law (the son who remained home). The latter observed the law but their motivation was wrong. They tried to buy salvation by scrupulous external observance. Their attitude was like that of the oldest son: "All these years I served you."

Unloving service is not far from servitude. Parents are annoyed when fear and calculation are the only reasons why the children obey them. Both sons were wrong. Hence, no matter with which one you must identify yourself, return to your Father who is merciful!

Saint of the Day for April 5th

Saint Vincent Ferrer's Story

The polarization in the Church today is a mild breeze compared with the tornado that ripped the Church apart during the lifetime of this saint. If any saint is a patron of reconciliation, Vincent Ferrer is.

Despite parental opposition, he entered the Dominican Order in his native Spain at 19. After brilliant studies, he was ordained a priest by Cardinal Peter de Luna—who would figure tragically in his life. Of a very ardent nature, Vincent practiced the austerities of his Order with great energy. He was chosen prior of the Dominican house in Valencia shortly after his ordination. The Western schism divided Christianity first between two, then three, popes. Clement VII lived at Avignon in France, Urban VI in Rome. Vincent was convinced the election of Urban was invalid, though Catherine of Siena was just as devoted a supporter of the Roman pope. In the service of Cardinal de Luna, Vincent worked to persuade Spaniards to follow Clement. When Clement died, Cardinal de Luna was elected at Avignon and became Benedict XIII.

Vincent worked for him as apostolic penitentiary and Master of the Sacred Palace. But the new pope did not resign as all candidates in the conclave had sworn to do. He remained stubborn, despite being deserted by the French king and nearly all of the cardinals.

Vincent became disillusioned and very ill, but finally took up the work of simply "going through the world preaching Christ," though he felt that any renewal in the Church depended on healing the schism. An eloquent and fiery preacher, he spent the last 20 years of his life spreading the Good News in Spain, France, Switzerland, the Low Countries and Lombardy, stressing the need of repentance and the fear of coming judgment. He became known as the "Angel of the Judgment."

Vincent tried unsuccessfully, in 1408 and 1415, to persuade his former friend to resign. He finally concluded that Benedict was not the true pope. Though very ill, he mounted the pulpit before an assembly over which Benedict himself was presiding, and thundered his denunciation of the man who had ordained him a priest. Benedict fled for his life, abandoned by those who had formerly supported him. Strangely, Vincent had no part in the Council of Constance, which ended the schism.
