SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS

In anticipation of the Jubilee of Families, Children, Grandparents and the Elderly, set within a yearlong celebration of hope, we remember the words of Pope Francis to families in his exhortation, Amoris Laetitia (AL): The incarnation of the Word in a human family, in Nazareth, by its very newness changed the history of the world. We need to enter into the mystery of Jesus' birth, into that "yes" given by Mary to the message of the angel, when the Word was conceived in her womb, as well as the "yes" of Joseph, who gave a name to Jesus and watched over Mary. (Amoris Laetitia, no. 65) When the Word was made flesh, the greatest gift of Hope was delivered to the human race. The story of Christ's birth is retold every year to remind us of this long-awaited gift that arrived in the form of a child. Every family experiences a similar moment of untold joy and hope with a child's arrival. The joy of love in families is rooted in hope despite the challenges and trials that life presents us. The letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians reminds us that love hopes all things. It does not despair of the future. In fact, every family is a symbol of hope for future generations.

Love, especially familial love, is rooted in the abiding promise of the Christ Child who came to renew all things and bring us everlasting peace. For this reason, despite the various trials, challenges, and sufferings--whether hidden or revealed-which every family experiences, Christian hope endures. Many families demonstrate a strong sense of calling to bear their crosses with decisive hope.

♦ KEY SAINTS

Holy Married Saints and Families

- St. Joseph and the Blessed Virgin Mary (c. 1st century BC-1st century AD, multiple feast days), the earthly parents of Jesus, who together form the Holy Family and exemplify a model of family life centered on faith, love, and obedience to God's will. St. Joseph is honored for his humility and obedience as a protector and provider, while Mary, Mother of God, is revered for her perfect discipleship and love through her acceptance of God's will.
- Sts. Joachim and Anne (c. 1st century BC-1st century AD, feast day July 26), parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and grandparents of Jesus. After years of keeping a steadfast faith and trust in God amidst the trial of infertility, Sts. Joachim and Anne received an angelic prophecy of a birth of a child, Mary, Mother of God. They are the patron saints of grandparents and infertile couples.
- Sts. Zechariah and Elizabeth (c. 1st century BC-1st century AD, feast day November 5), parents of St. John the Baptist, the forerunner parents of St. John the Baptist, the forerunner of Christ. A devout elderly couple who faced infertility for many decades before God intervened, their story illustrates themes of hope, patience, and prayer.
- Sts. Aquila and Priscilla (c. 1st century, feast day July 8), a married couple and early Christian missionaries mentioned by Paul as "co-workers in Christ Jesus" (Romans 16:3). They are recognized for their hospitality, commitment to the Church, and willingness to risk their lives for the sake of the Gospel.

WHAT THE FIRST READING SAYS TO ME

This passage continues the First Reading of last Sunday. Paul and Barnabas had baptized Gentiles without having them first circumcised and telling them to observe the law of Moses. Some Christians from Jewish backgrounds did not agree. Hence, Paul and Barnabas decided to go up to Jerusalem an ask the apostles for a decision. There was a lengthy discussion on the issue now brought out in the open: Should Christianity be a renewal movement in the framework of Judaism, or should it outgrow it to a certain extent? The consensus was that in the spirit of the founder, Jesus Christ, there should be profound renewal, yet also continuity. compromise was then reached: Gentiles may join the Church by baptism alone and do not have to be circumcised, but they should follow a few law in order to facilitate social contact with Christians from Jewish background.

WHAT THE SECOND READING SAYS TO ME

Utilizing the language of vision, the sacred writer describes the splendor of the Church, see in the earthly and heavenly Church in one perspective. The language is highly symbolic. The Church has a particular brilliance which is the divine indwelling. In order to understand the symbolism of this passage one must remember that in New Testament thinking the Church is the "Israel of God," succeeding the "Israel of the flesh."

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

Continuing the main thought of today's readings, this passage from John wants us to keep in mind that Jesus did not outline all the institutional details of the Church he founded. He left this up to the apostles and their successors. However, Jesus specified that in organizing the Church they should be true to his words and Spirit, the Paraclete: "The Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything." We should have confidence that Jesus keeps his promise. Preparing for Pentecost, pray often: "Come, Holy Spirit and enkindle in us the fire of our love."

Saint of the Day - May 26th *Saint Philip Neri*

St Philip Neri was always quick to say that all the miracles done through him were the work of the Holy Spirit. All his life Philip had a great devotion to the Holy Spirit, in response to his mystical experience of 1544, when, while praying in the catacombs of Rome, he experienced the Holy Spirit as a ball of fire entering him and filling his heart; a living flame of love that made his heart swell. Saint Philip, the founder of the Oratorians, described the Holy Spirit as "the master of prayer," who "causes us to abide in continual peace and cheerfulness, which is a foretaste of Paradise." Led by the Holy Spirit, Philip Neri became renowned for his joy, his sense of humour, his great charity and his passionate preaching, which focused on encouraging people to lead a good life. In the face of trials or persecution, Saint Philip said "we must keep our eyes on God." May the Spirit of Truth, the Helper, fill our hearts and minds with truth and love, so that we might serve God in our neighbour, in peace and cheerfulness.

St Augustine of Canterbury - May 27th

Saint Augustine and his fellow missionary monks were not the first to bring the Gospel to British shores. His, rather, was a reviving and expansion of what had gone before. Pope Gregory the Great had great missionary zeal as Pope, and so he chose Augustine, a fellow monk from his community to lead a small group to the Kingdom of Kent. However, they almost didn't reach their destination, as the monks took fright at the enormity of the task. The example of Saint Augustine of Canterbury teaches us that we overcome our missionary fear through confidence in Christ. Moreover, just as Pope Francis had called the Church to reach out to the margins, so did Gregory the Great in sending Augustine to a land where Christianity had dwindled. Mission is not only about breaking new ground, but is also about turning over and refreshing soil that has been left fallow. We are to reach out to those who are on the margins of society, and plant the seeds of God's Word of love, that they might flourish. May our love of Christ also rekindle the flame of faith in others who have lost heart through the challenges of life.
