LECTIO DIVINA



"Eternal rest grant unto them, Lord..."

Read: Wisdom reminds us that the holy souls are at peace with God. Saint Paul writes of Christ's victory over death. Jesus describes the Last Judgement, when we will be judged on our love.

Reflect: Death seems so final, but faith assures us that death has been transformed by Christ's cross and resurrection into the beginning of our life in all its fullness with God. There is sadness as we remember those we miss dearly. But that sadness is not empty, since we have hope in the resurrection. And so, we pray for the souls of the departed, that they might be forgiven their sins and welcomed into God's Kingdom. November is traditionally dedicated to praying for the souls in purgatory. Purgatory is our purification after death which enables us to stand before God with a renewed heart. We support the faithful departed by praying that God might shower his mercy upon them and draw them ever closer to himself. WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME

The first reading provides a reflection on the true fate of the righteous, asserting that despite appearances of suffering or death to the foolish, their souls are in God's care and are at peace. The passage emphasizes that God tests the faithful like gold, ultimately leading to eternal life and a future where they will shine and judge nations, while those who reject God are scorned in a future judgment. The central message is a call to trust in God's love and power, understanding that true value is found not in worldly success but righteousness, which immortality with God.

WHAT THE 2ND READING SAYS TO ME

The second reading reflects that baptism signifies a spiritual union with Christ in his death, burial, and resurrection, meaning believers are freed from the dominion of sin and no longer need to live as slaves to it. Instead, they are united with Christ in his new life, transitioning from an "old self" dominated by sin to a "new life" of righteousness. The key message is that this new life is not about overcoming sin through personal effort but is a result of being "crucified with Christ," which breaks the power of sin over them.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

The Gospel reading today teaches us that one will be judged based on how they have shown love and mercy to others, particularly those in need, because in serving the "least of these," they are serving Jesus. The parable illustrates that those who are judged as "sheep" are blessed for caring for the hungry, thirsty, stranger, naked, sick, and imprisoned, while the "goats" are condemned for neglecting them. The reflection focuses on the idea that love is not an abstract concept but is demonstrated through tangible acts of kindness and that our actions toward vulnerable people are a reflection of our relationship with God.

SAINT OF THE DAY

November 3, 2025 Saint Martin de Porres' Story

"Father unknown" is the cold legal phrase sometimes used on baptismal records. "Half-breed" or "war souvenir" is the cruel name inflicted by those of "pure" blood. Like many others, Martin de Porres might have grown to be a bitter man, but he did not. It was said that even as a child he gave his heart and his goods to the poor and despised. He was the son of a freed woman of Panama, probably black but also possibly of indigenous stock, and a Spanish grandee of Lima, Peru. His parents never married each other. Martin inherited the features and dark complexion of his mother. That irked his father, who finally acknowledged his son after eight years. After the birth of a sister, the father abandoned the family. Martin was reared in poverty. locked into a low level of Lima's society.

When Martin de Porres was 12, his mother apprenticed him to a barber-surgeon. Martin learned how to cut hair and also how to draw blood—a standard medical treatment then—care for wounds, and prepare and administer medicines.

After a few years in this medical apostolate, Martin de Porres applied to the Dominicans to be a "lay helper," not feeling himself worthy to be a religious brother. After nine years, the example of his prayer and penance, charity and humility, led the community to request him to make full religious profession. Many of his nights were spent in prayer and penitential practices; his days were filled with nursing the sick and caring for the poor.

It was particularly impressive that he treated all people regardless of their color, race, or status. He was instrumental in founding an orphanage, took care of slaves brought from Africa, and managed the daily alms of the priory with practicality, as well as generosity. He became the procurator for both priory and city, whether it was a matter of "blankets, shirts, candles, candy, miracles or prayers!" When his priory was in debt, he said, "I am only a poor mulatto. Sell me. I am the property of the order. Sell me."
