LECTIO DIVINA



"Stay Awake."

Read: Isaiah has a vision of the end times in which the nation converge on Sion in peace. Saint Paul urges the Christians to await the Lord by walking in the ways of light. Jesus preaches about his glorious return and tells the people to stay awake.

Reflect: Advent is a very short season, and it's probably mentally shortened even further by the commercial anticipation Christmas. Therefore, we often jump straight to the second focus of Advent, namely the first coming of Christ at the incarnation. However, the Church calls us at the beginning of the new liturgical year to look forward to Christ's glorious return, and to the end of time. Jesus warned his disciples to "stay awake," to be prepared for his return, so that they would not be spiritually asleep like many in Noah's day. Our hearts are to be prepared to welcome Christ. This is the purpose of Advent: a preparation for Christ's coming to us, so that we truly long for him. This welcoming starts now, and not just at the end of time, since Christ also comes to us silently in prayer and in the Eucharist.

Pray: Meditate upon the phrase Come, Lord Jesus or the Aramaic Maranatha.

WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME

Inspired by God, the prophet Isaiah sees a bright future in the Messianic era-the time when God will appear in his Messiah, his anointed vicegerent on earth. The setting is Zion, the holy mountain of Jerusalem with the temple, God's dwelling place.

"They shall beat their swords into plowshares..., nor shall they ever train for war again." Wishful thinking? We Christians see Isaiah's vision fulfilled in Jesus, God's anointed one, the Christ. Therefore, "O house of Jacob [God's people], come, let us walk in the light of the LORD."

With God, present in Christ Jesus, we should keep working for this seemingly impossible dream. Start in your family, in your school, at your job, making them places of Shalom-peace.

WHAT THE 2ND READING SAYS TO ME

Be watchful! Wake up! Orgies, drunkenness, promiscuity, lust, rivalry, and jealousy are part of the human condition. The deeds of darkness can make us numb and insensitive to the beauty of life.

"Put on the Lord Jesus," i.e., be ever more intimately united to him and what he stands for, and a bright future of Shalom-peace-will be yours.

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

The coming of the Lord requires a decision. It is "either-or"! Matthew the evangelist is quite serious about this. It should be a decision of "conversion" to Jesus right now, as you are preparing for his coming on Christmas.

Again, be watchful! The moment you least expect it could be the final coming of the Lord to you. Do not become so engrossed in the daily routine of life that you forget that the Day of the Son of Man may come at any time.

SAINT OF THE DAY

Thursday 4th December, 2025

Saint John Damascene's Story
John Damascene spent most of his life in the Monastery of Saint Sabas near Jerusalem, and all of his life under Muslim rule, indeed protected by it.

He was born in Damascus, received a classical and theological education, and followed his father in a government position under the Arabs. After a few years, he resigned and went to the Monastery of Saint Sabas.

He is famous in three areas:

First, he is known for his writings against the iconoclasts, who opposed the veneration of images. Paradoxically, it was the Eastern Christian emperor Leo who forbade the practice, and it was because John lived in Muslim territory that his enemies could not silence him.

Second, he is famous for his treatise, Exposition of the Orthodox Faith, a summary of the Greek Fathers, of which he became the last. It is said that this book is for Eastern schools what the Summa of Aquinas became for the West.

Third, he is known as a poet, one of the two greatest of the Eastern Church, the other being Romanus the Melodist. His devotion to the Blessed Mother and his sermons on her feasts are well known.

Saint John Damascene's liturgical feast is celebrated on April 30.

Reflection

John Damascene defended the Church's understanding of the veneration of images and explained the faith of the Church in several other controversies. For over 30 years, he combined a life of prayer with these defenses and his other writings. His holiness expressed itself in putting his literary and preaching talents at the service of the Lord.
