Jubilee 2025

Pilgrims on the Way of Hope CatechistsSeptember 26–28, 2025

The Holy See has designated a number of Jubilee Days throughout 2025 to recognize and celebrate different groups of people and various ministries in the Church. The Jubilee of Catechists will be held from Friday, September 26, to Sunday, September 28, 2025.

WHAT IS A CATECHIST?

A catechist is a "Christian who receives a particular calling from God that, when accepted in faith, empowers him/her for the service of the transmission of faith and for the task of initiating others into the Christian life" .

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION

"The Church was founded so that by spreading Christ's kingdom throughout the world to the glory of God the Father, every man and woman may share in the saving work of redemption, and so that through them the entire world may be truly directed towards Christ". The Church teaches us that "in the building up of Christ's Body various members and functions have their part to play. There is only one Spirit who, according to his own richness and the needs of the ministries, gives his different gifts for the welfare of the Church".

The call to be a catechist is rooted in a person's Baptism, strengthened by Confirmation and by regular participation in the Eucharistic Sacrifice. Originally the term catechist referred to one who taught by mouth, but soon the term came to refer to any person who "instructed in the Word."

KEY SAINTS AND BLESSEDS

Holy Catechist Companions

- St. Paul the Apostle (1st century, feast days January 25 and June 29), patron of Rome, evangelists, missionaries, and theologians. The great preacher of the kerygma and catechizer of Christians.
- St. Charles Borromeo (1538-1584, feast day November 4), patron of bishops, catechists, catechumens, cardinals, seminarians, and spiritual directors and leaders: helped greatly in the development of the Roman Catechism and helped to implement the reforms called for by the Council of Trent.
- St. John Bosco (1815-1888, feast day January 31), patron of editors, juvenile delinquents, publishers, students, young children, founder of the Salesian Congregation. St. John Bosco dedicated his life to educating young girls and boys, beginning with orphans, whom he taught to read and write.

WHAT THE 1ST READING SAYS TO ME

Amos describes the luxurious living of his time and blames the wealthy for not caring about the collapse of Joseph. Like Israel [Jacob] and Judah, Joseph is one of the Jewish patriarchs. Their names are often used just to indicate God's people.

The "woe" of this message is addressed as God's word to the wealthy of all times and cultures. The Lord "gives food to the hungry," but he needs our hands to distribute.

WHAT THE 2ND READING SAYS TO ME

Paul reminds his disciple and coworker Timothy of the day of his baptism, when "in the presence of many witnesses" he made his noble profession of faith. "I charge you... to keep the commandment." "Compete well for the faith." (As a bornand-bred city boy Paul loved the games!) We renew our profession of faith every year at Easter, and as often as we are godparents at a baptism. We do it even every Sunday. Make it meaningful!

WHAT THE GOSPEL SAYS TO ME

In relating this parable of the rich man and poor Lazarus, Luke brings out a message similar to that of Amos in the First Reading. It is a "woe" to the have's! And those who have enough should not say that they did not know about poverty and misery in their area! You have your Bible. Read it prayerfully!



Saint of the Day - September 27th, 2025

Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael's Story

Angels—messengers from God—appear frequently in Scripture, but only Michael, Gabriel and Raphael are named.

Michael appears in Daniel's vision as "the great prince" who defends Israel against its enemies; in the Book of Revelation, he leads God's armies to final victory over the forces of evil. Devotion to Michael is the oldest angelic devotion, rising in the East in the fourth century. The Church in the West began to observe a feast honoring Michael and the angels in the fifth century.

Gabriel also makes an appearance in Daniel's visions, announcing Michael's role in God's plan. His best-known appearance is an encounter with a young Jewish girl named Mary, who consents to bear the Messiah.

Raphael's activity is confined to the Old Testament story of Tobit. There he appears to guide Tobit's son Tobiah through a series of fantastic adventures which lead to a threefold happy ending: Tobiah's marriage to Sarah, the healing of Tobit's blindness, and the restoration of the family fortune.

The memorials of Gabriel and Raphael were added to the Roman calendar in 1921. The 1970 revision of the calendar joined their individual feasts to Michael's.

Reflection

Each of the archangels performs a different mission in Scripture: Michael protects; Gabriel announces; Raphael guides. Earlier belief that inexplicable events were due to the actions of spiritual beings has given way to a scientific world-view and a different sense of cause and effect. Yet believers still experience God's protection, communication, and guidance in ways which defy description. We cannot dismiss angels too lightly.


