

ASHAKI GOODWIN



Ashaki began her faith journey when she received the sacrament of baptism at the St. Joseph's Catholic Church in 1986.

She attended the St. John's Catholic Primary School and then went on to the Antigua Girls' High School where she graduated in 2003. She then attended the

Antigua State College and upon graduation went onto the University of the West Indies. At the University of the West Indies, Ashaki attained a Bachelor of Science in Political Science with Law and then a Master of Science in Regional Integration Studies.

Currently she is employed by the Government of Antigua and Barbuda in the Division of Trade, Industry and Commerce. Ashaki plans to pursue further studies sometime in the near future.

From a young age, Ashaki was involved in many activities. These included the St. John's Catholic Primary School Glee Club and the drumming group with Mr. Patrick Thomas.

During her confirmation years, Ashaki became a catechist aid assisting with Paraliturgy and Monday Religious Education Classes. During the summer, she was a volunteer with the HFC annual Summer Camp where she enjoyed working in the Kitchen Department.

Through discussions with Fr. George Williams, they brought a group of young people together and began the Discernment Group for persons interested in religious life or simply a life of serving God.

Before going off to University, Ashaki was an active

participant in the HFC Youth Council. During that period, she enjoyed planning the Joint-Parish Youth Masses and the after church activities.

Since returning back to Antigua, through her strong faith and spiritual background Ashaki has remained steadfast in Youth Ministry and is currently a member of the HFC Youth Council.

Of course all of these activities must come with a balance, which is sometimes extremely hard. Many Friday nights, Ashaki spends her time with the Youth Council discussing upcoming activities or planning fun socials for our young people.


Youth Events
