

#### HOLY FAMILY PARISH ACTIVITIES

Another activity held at Holy Family Cathedral Parish was the Health Fair, organized by the Parish Council. This was a two day event that was open to the general public as well as the church community. There was a Pediatrician, Gynecologist, General practitioners, and even a Naturalist. Day One was the educational aspect of the Health Fair. On day two screenings for, cholesterol, blood pressure, blood sugar, BMI, breast cancer talk and screening and prostate screening. The Parish Council thanked the Doctors for sharing their expertise and time.





The month of November concluded with a Parish Assembly, with guest speaker, Grenadian born Sr. Julie Peters, working in Trinidad. Sister is from the Congregation of the Sisters of the Sorrowful Mother – Third Order Regular Order of St. Francis of Assisi. Sister's address was "A Caribbean Approach to New Evangelization". The main purpose of the Assembly was to begin a new process of Evangelization and a Way Forward for the next three years. #### DELAMINE ANDREW



My name is Delamine Andrew. I am an employee of the Government of Antigua and Barbuda with specific responsibilities within the Environment Division as an Environment Officer. My journey within the Catholic Faith was a bit unorthodox. Although my mother and grandmother were rooted Catholics, I

spent the first 10 years of my life attending Pentecostal churches because they were closer to my home at the time. However, my mother ensured that I knew most of the basic prayers within the Catholic Faith. We prayed the rosary together at least once a week and I can easily recall her enthusiasm when reciting the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

At the age of 10 we moved closer to the Holy Family Cathedral Parish, and it was there that I began my initiation into the Catholic Faith. I was enrolled into the Christ the King High School and began confirmation classes two years later. I slowly became actively involved in various Church activities. I was first a member of the Youth Choir for about 3 years then became a catechist aide, assisting Mrs. Blackman in the instructions of First Communion candidates. I later moved unto Para-liturgy, and the Religious Education Group (Monday School). I then became a member of the Public Speaking Society, writing plays, animating and reading at Masses and other events.

At the invitation of the Most Reverend Archbishop Reece, I attended a retreat workshop for the members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. I was so inspired by the work of the Vincentians, that I briefly joined the adult group and under the guidance of Mrs. Mary-Rose Knight founded the St. Maria Goretti Youth Conference as the youth arm for HFC St. Vincent de Paul. The group underwent various training seminars and retreats

before assisting the needy. Activities included visiting the elderly at the St. Vincent de Paul Day Care Centre; and visiting and offering guidance to the girls at the Good Sheppard Home. New members were recruited from the various confirmation classes, however, following my migration to the UK to pursue undergraduate studies in City and Regional Planning, the group was disbanded. Even while I was away, I tried to maintain my spiritual growth through the Catholic Student Chaplaincy at Oxford Brookes University. I continued to participate at student masses, and attended monthly bible discussions, amongst other activities. Returning home was a difficult transition but through the constant "nagging" of my mother and Mrs. Morvette Thomas, I resumed activeness within the Church. I currently assist in the preparation of Confirmation candidates and continue to read at Masses. I some day hope to return to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul because it's a Society that I greatly admire. It is also the Society that greatly
